Cattle on hand, 882; hogs, 16; sheep, 15; horses, 4. Butcher calves and yearlings: good to choice, 60 to 62.5 cents per pound; standard, 57 to 60 cents; utility, 53 to 57 cents; culls, 53 cents and down.

Packer cows: heifers, 47 to 54 cents per pound; utility, 40 to 47 cents (high dressing); cutters, 33 to 40 cents (low dressing); canners, 33 cents and down.

Packer pulls: commercial, 50 to 56.5 cents per pound; utility, 47 to 50 cents; cutters, 43 to 47 cents; canners, 43 cents and down.

Stocker and feeder calves and yearlings: heavy: Hereford and Angus steer calves, 60 to 78 cents per pound; Hereford and Angus heifer calves, 55 to 63 cents; crossbred steer calves, 60 to 78 cents; crossbred heifer calves, 55 to 63 cents; replacement heifers, 60 to 75 cents. Light: Hereford and Angus steer calves, 78 cents to \$1.15 per pound; Hereford and Angus heifer calves, 63 to 80 cents; crossbred steer calves, 78 cents to \$1.10; crossbred heifer calves, 63 to 80 cents; light plain calves, 45 to 55 cents.

The so-called "button" batteries which power everything from electronic wrist watches to hand calculators and toys, are being swallowed accidentally by an increasing number of small children, says Dr. Mary Ann Shirer, a health education specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Each year between 500 and 800 button batteries are swallowed, says Shirer.

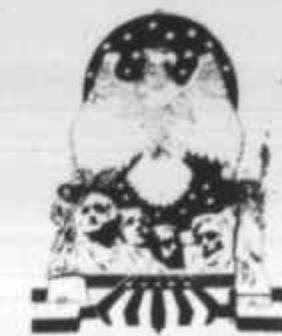
