Renee Hunt on dean's list

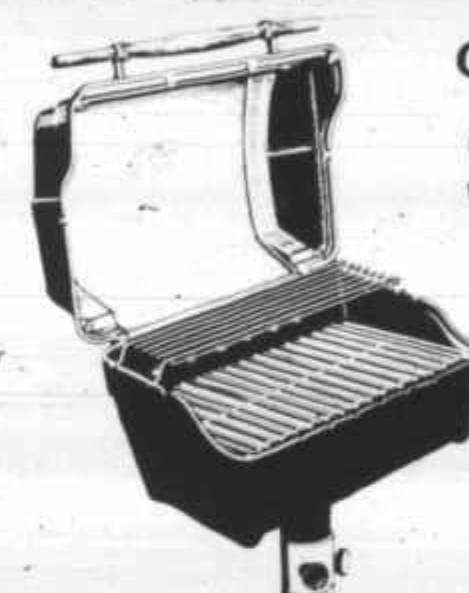
