Wharton County Junior College will again offer student transportation this year. A driver is needed for the bus which will take students from the Wharton campus to the greater College service area according to Billy Griffith, director of student services.

There is no cost to students who live in the WCJC District but out-of-district residents will be charged a fee of \$80 per semester.

The transportation policy has been changed this school year due to constantly escalating expenses for busing. Other Texas junior colleges already charge fares if they have bus routes.

Most passengers are eligible for student aid since transportation costs can be calculated into their grants. Transportation to and from Bay City and Edna will be by College buses. The Edna route picks up

Butcher Calves and Yearlings: good to choice, 57 to 61 cents per pound; standard, 55 to 57 cents; utility, 53 to 55 cents; culls, 53 cents (down).

Packer Cows: heiferettes, 45 to 52 cents per pound; utility, 38 to 42.50 cents (high dressing); culls, 32 to 38 cents (low dressing); canners, 32 cents (down).

Packer Bulls: commercial, 50 to 54.50 cents per pound; utility, 48 to 50 cents; culls, 43 to 45 cents; canners, 43 cents (down).

Stockers and Feeder Calves and Yearlings: Hereford and Angus steer calves, 58 to 75 cents per pound; Hereford and Angus heifer calves, 56 to 63 cents; replacement heifers, 60 to 72 cents.

Light: Hereford and Angus steer calves, 75 cents to \$1.05 per pound; Hereford and Angus heifer calves, 63 to 75 cents; light plain calves, 45 to 55 cents.

How to cut the cost of staying cool

If your home is air conditioned, your cooling system uses up more than half the electricity you pay every month during the summer. And since summer in South Texas lasts a long time, it's worth a little extra effort to put the air conditioner on a low kilowatt-hour diet. Here are some reminders that will help:

TUNE IT UP. Before the hot season begins, have your air conditioner cleaned and checked by a qualified technician. An annual checkup can prevent costly repair bills and keep your unit running at top efficiency.

DON'T OVERCOOL. Keep the thermostat at 78°. Each degree below that setting could add another 14% to the cost of operating your air conditioner.

STOP AIR LEAKS. A large amount of costly air infiltration enters through wall light switch outlets and plug-in sockets. For about \$10, an entire house can be sealed in these places with inexpensive gaskets. In addition, you'll want to caulk all cracks and

holes, and install weather stripping around windows and doors.

BLOCK OUT THE SUN. Keep direct sunlight out of the house with draperies, blinds, shades or awnings. Plant trees and shrubs for additional shade.

TURN ON THE FANS. You'll use less air conditioning comfortably at a higher thermostat setting with electric fans.

SHOP CAREFULLY. If you plan to buy a new air conditioner, choose a unit with an Energy Efficiency Ratio (EER or SEER) of 8 or above. You also need to make sure the unit is properly sized.
