"Oriental Salad" TIPS TO CLIP

It is time for salads again! With the trend to look, salads are becoming a more and more important part of today's menus, and no longer are they just lettuce and a sliver of tomato with a tomato dressing drizzled over. There are variety greens, bean and alfalfa sprouts, southern seeds, chopped eggs and scores of new dressings. Here is an unusual and very tasty, yet simple salad. Try it next time you have a side-dish menu.

Oriental Salad
1/2 c. salad oil
2 tbsp. vinegar
1 tsp. sugar
2 tbsp. orange juice
1 tsp. lemon juice
dash ginger
1/4 tsp. salt
2 (11 oz) cans mandarin oranges, drained
4 cups mixed greens (lettuce, endive, spinach) torn into bite-size pieces

Combine everything but oranges and greens. Add oranges and greens in refrigerator at least 10 hours. Toss with greens in salad bowl. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

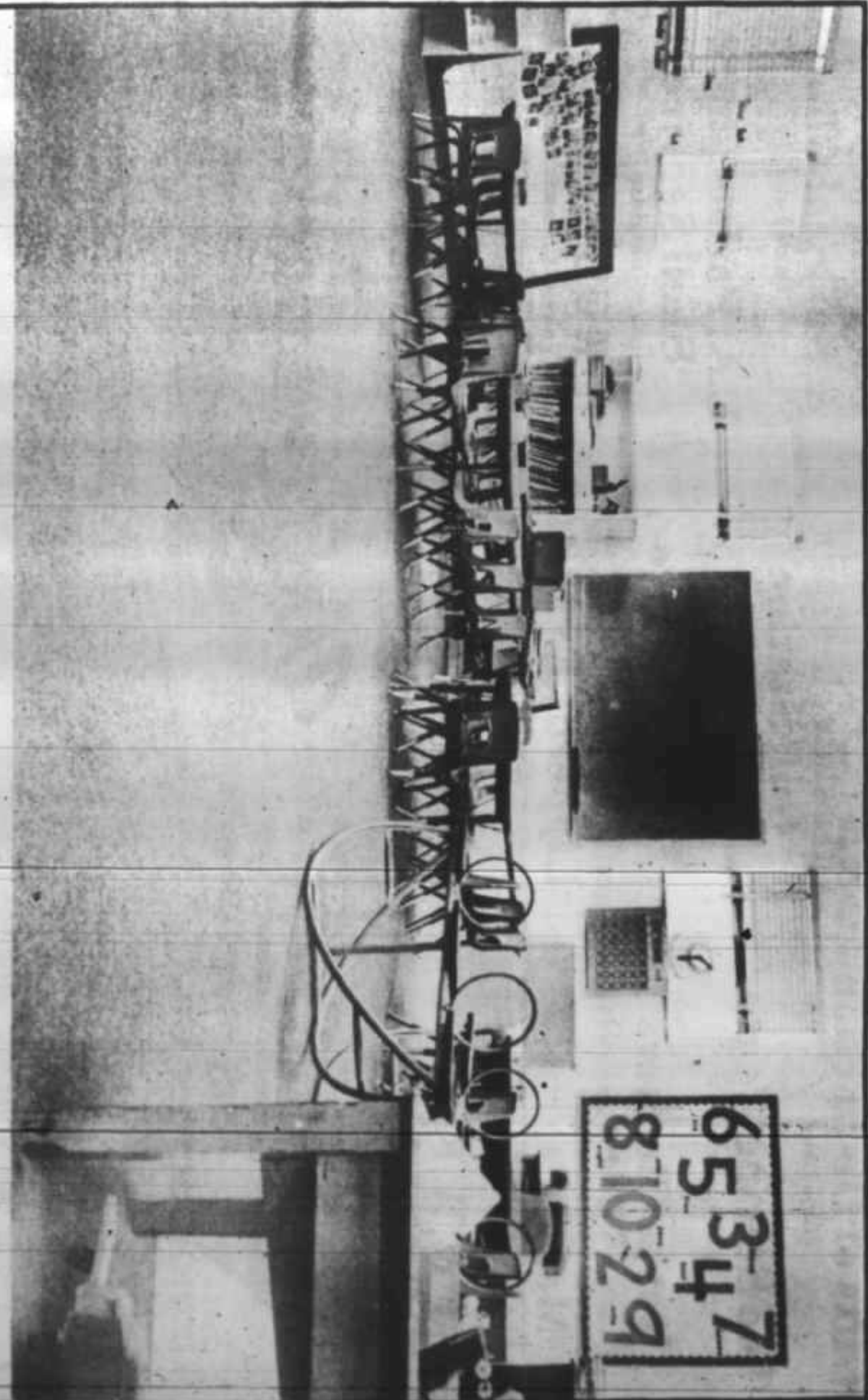
