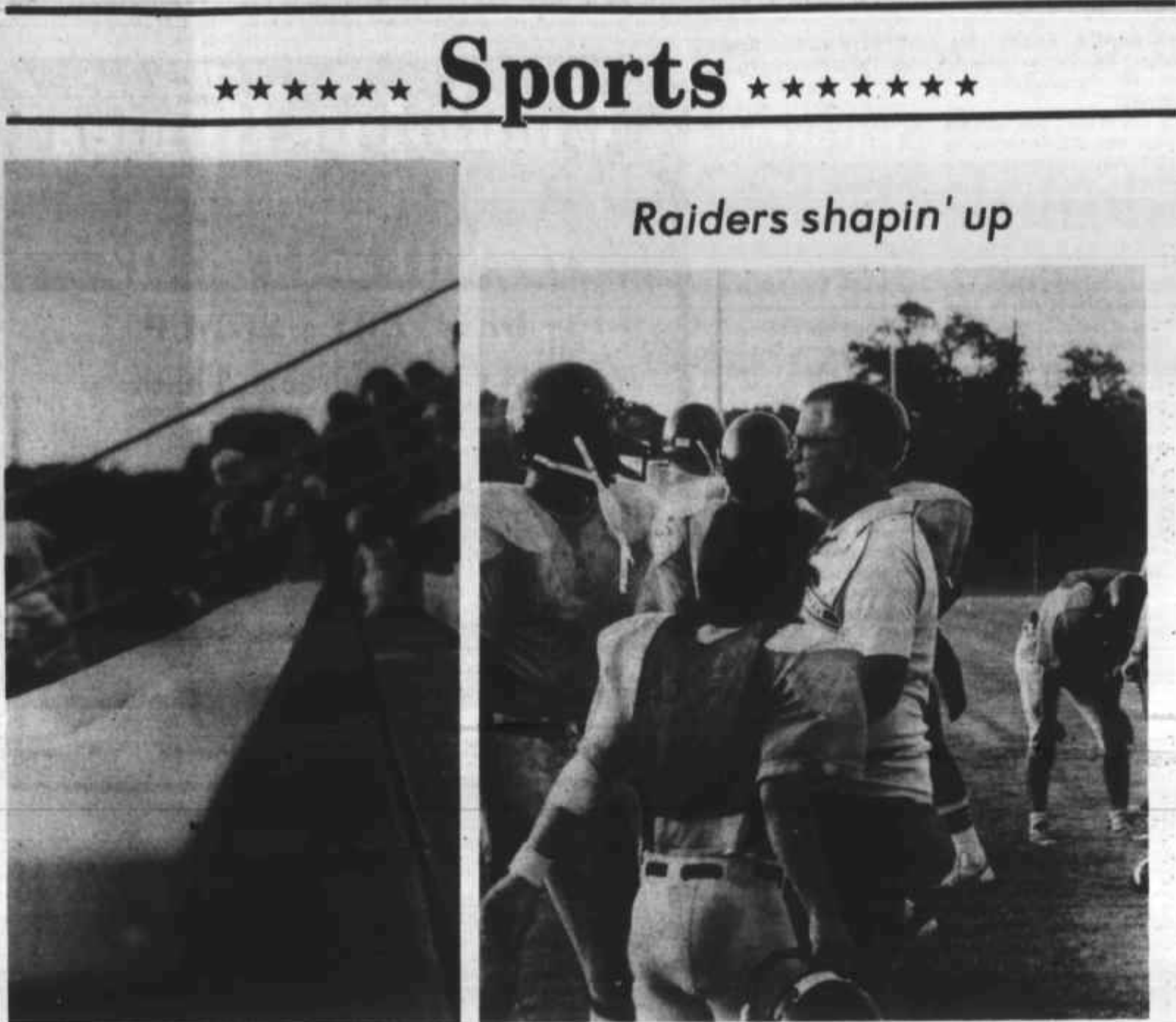

Three-zone dove setup adopted

Arrest made by sheriff in Nada Store burglary

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission has approved a new three-zone alignment for dove hunting for the upcoming seasons. Meeting in Austin last week, the commission established the Panhandle, Central and Rio Grande Zones. The new alignment replaces the two-zone system which had been in effect since 1946 (see map).

Ron George, dove program leader for the Parks and Wildlife Department, told commission members the three-zone system was designed to provide optimum hunting opportunity for hunters when the birds are available, within the context of proper management.

Significant changes brought about by the new alignment include a September 1 opening date for a large portion of Southeast Texas which formerly had the later South Zone opening date; a quick service, plus 10 per cent discount on labor. George's Gun Shop, Columbus, Texas, 732-5833.

The new system also utilizes highways for boundary lines for better delineation of zone boundaries. Under the two zone system, county boundaries were used.

The Panhandle Zone mourning dove season will be September 1-October 30, 1983, and January 7-16, 1984; the Rio Grande season will be September 17-November 5, 1983 and January 7-22, 1984.

The statewide bag limit will be 12 doves, not to include more than two white-winged doves. Shooting hours will be one-half before sunrise to sunset.

As in the past, all persons who hunt white-winged doves will be required to have a White-winged Dove Stamp in their possession in addition to a valid hunting license. The stamp requirement applies to any person taking or hunting white-winged doves statewide. A hunting license is not required of persons hunting doves in the county of residence.

On August 9, the Colorado County Sheriff's Office arrested Thor Castillo, 20, of El Campo, on a charge of burglary of the Nada Store which occurred on July 24.

Castillo was arrested at his home after information was obtained from an informer, and evidence that Castillo had items stolen from the store under his control, the Sheriff said.

Castillo has been released from jail on \$50,000 bond. Sheriff's officers believe there are more persons involved in the burglary and the investigation is continuing.

The Wharton County Sheriff's Office, Texas Ranger Ray Nutt and a detective from the El Campo police department are assisting in the investigation.

In conjunction with the death in the Garwood in June of 1982, the sheriff's office has arrested Felipe Puerta, 45, of Katy. The department made the arrest after it received information on August 10 from the crime laboratory in Austin. The sheriff would not release the nature of the information. Steven Lieman was killed about 14 months ago when he was run over by a vehicle. Puerta is in the Colorado County Jail in lieu of \$100,000 bond, and his case will be presented to the county grand jury in September.

In other news, the Sheriff reported: "That Lil Seger of Altair reported her mobile home had been broken into, and a necklace was missing. The burglary was reported at 12:36 p.m. on August 6."

Also on August 6, The sheriff's office was advised of a break-in at the Ron Moston and Dewyn Foster camp house on County Road 217. Taken was a portable color television and three baseball caps. Foster and Dewyn live in Houston.

"During the past week the sheriff's office has investigated damage to 11 mail boxes in the county. Ten boxes were found damaged on County Road 806 and one on Calhoun Road near Eagle Lake.

Stocks: good stocker cows and heifers \$350 to \$425; commercial and medium stocker cows and heifers, \$250 to \$350; good cow and calf pairs, \$550 to \$650; medium cow and calf pairs, \$450 to \$550; common cow and calf pairs, \$350 to \$450; old worn out, split and weighed.

September 10-18 is teal duck season

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission has approved September 10-18, 1983, as statewide special dates for hunting all species of teal ducks.

As in the past, the daily bag limit will be four teal in the aggregate; possession limit eight. Shooting hours will be sunrise to sunset statewide.

The special teal season gives waterfowl hunters the opportunity to hunt early-arriving teal which often pass through much of the state before the opening of regular waterfowl seasons.

Seasons and bag limits for ducks, geese and sandhill cranes will be adopted by the commission on August 31.
