

Garwood-Sheridan Raiders even at 1-1

The Raiders of the Garwood-Sheridan team evened their season record at 1-1 last week in Sheridan when they beat Damon 30-0, according to coaches Benny Machac and Mike Michalka.

The first game of the season the previous week saw Schulerberg come out on top by a score of 22-14 in 30-0, according to coaches Benny Machac and Mike Michalka.

The young Sheridan team managed only 13 plays the second, third and fourth quarters, losing five fumbles.

But in the Damon game, Derrick Stevens returned the opening kick-off for an 80-yard touchdown. The two-point conversion was good on an Albert Lopez dive up the middle.

Later in the first quarter, Johnny Barker scored on an option right play for 40 yards out. Lopez again converted to add two more points to the score.

An interception by Lopez before halftime gave the Raiders another score. He ran that one in from 70 yards away. A third-quarter

score by Lopez gave the team its final points. "Everyone got to play," Coach Machac said. Rushing statistics show Barker had 76 yards, Freddy Soto had 22, and Perdue had 20. Defensively, Derrick Stevens was in seven tackles, Lopez five, Graham, Barker, and George Moreno, each had four, while Cobb and Perdue were credited with three each.
