For most of the game last Friday night at Raider Stadium, fans may have felt their home team had a good opportunity to beat LaGrange, and take a nice district ranking into this week's action.

But, it wasn't to be as LaGrange slipped in another score late in the fourth quarter to break a 29-all tie, and capture the game-winning touchdown.

That win put LaGrange at the top of the district standings, ahead of tough Brookshire-Royal only in the points scored category. Both teams have identical 2-0 records in district play, and 4-1 records overall. LaGrange has scored 71 points in district action, and Royal only 58, although Royal's defense appears tougher by allowing only 19 points to be scored against them. LaGrange has allowed 49.

Winless in district play, Rice is tied with Hempstead and Bellville, each with one loss and one tie.
