1983 full of changes for Parks and Wildlife

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department officials believe 1983 was one of the most significant years in recent history for their agency.

Progress was made in many areas, but department officials believe passage of the Wildlife Conservation Act by the Texas Legislature during 1983 probably exceeded all other happenings in importance.

The act placed authority for managing fish and wildlife resources in all Texas counties in the hands of the Parks and Wildlife Commission, a nine-member panel which sets policy for the department. The act became effective Aug. 29, 1983.

Before that date, all hunting and fishing laws in 13 Texas counties and certain laws in 72 were set by the legislature, and regulations set by the department in 30 other counties were subject to review by local county commissioners' courts. As a result, Texas game laws were among the most complicated and contradictory of any state in the nation and differed in many counties from those recommended by the commission.

While fish and game laws will not be totally uniform across a state with such diverse environmental areas, officials believe the act will allow more standardization and efficient use of the state's renewable wildlife resources, based on biological considerations.

The Legislature also made a significant change by increasing the Parks and Wildlife Commission from six to nine members during

1983. The following is a review of significant events and accomplishments of the Parks and Wildlife Department during the year:

Wildlife With passage of the Wildlife Conservation Act, the commission immediately removed special protection of spike bucks (buck deer with only single antlers without prongs or forks) in all counties, classifying them with other bucks. This results from intensive studies of white-tailed deer showing that spike bucks are nutritionally and genetically inferior.

The commission created the state's first three-zone dove hunting alignment, replacing a two-zone setup which was basically unchanged since 1943. The three zones utilize major highways for better boundary delineation, and the state was segmented to offer the most shooting opportunities when the birds are available.

In another change designed to increase hunting opportunity, the commission established a three-segment split duck season for the eastern two-thirds of the state for the 1983-84 season.

The department's Wildlife Division established the new 86,500-acre Matagorda Island Wildlife Management Area as a result of the transfer of management authority of the island from the federal government to the state. The first state-controlled

public hunts were held on the island during December, and numerous wildlife management and research projects are planned there for the future.

The Legislature established a special nongame and endangered species fund for the department to use in a wide range of programs, including research, management, habitat acquisition, survey and information dissemination. Funding sources include grants and contributions, sales of stamps and art reproductions and fees connected to easements and leases.

Through an agreement with the U.S. Forest Service, the commission established three peacock hatchery near Corpus Christi, and initial production of more than 7 million red drum (redfish) fingerlings for stocking in Texas bays was perhaps the most significant fishery news event of 1983. The facility, billed as the only one of its kind in the world, was the result of a unique cooperative effort by the department, the Gulf Coast Conservation Association (GCCA) and Central Power and Light Co. of Corpus Christi (CP&L). The GCCA provided constructed funds, the CP&L donated land and established for that species, and also introduced redfish at Lakes Tardavious, Bluff Springs, Kirby, Wichita and Bryan Utilities.

Florida-strain large-mouth bass stocking programs continued, and benefits of previous stocking became even more apparent, with numerous lakes now having produced documented catches of largemouths 13 pounds or larger.

During September, crews stocked 3,000 fingerling-sized peacock bass at the 900-acre Alcos Reservoir near Rockdale. The colorful South American game fish produced by the Heart O' the Hills Research Station at Ingram. Biologists believe Alcos is potentially the best lake available for establishing a reproducing population of the fish.

Biologists believe the introduction of 1,300 small Nile Perch at Lake Fairfield during 1983 also was significant, being the first ever release of fingerling-sized fish of the species in Texas bays.
