Divisional Special Olympics on Saturday will give 178 a chance to learn, compete

Preparations are nearly complete for the 11-county Special Olympics outdoor meet to be held this Saturday, March 31, in Columbus. Arrival and check-in of the athletes begins at 8 a.m., followed by opening ceremonies at 9 a.m. The olympics is sponsored here by the Colorado County Special Olympics committee, a division of Area III Special Olympics. Last year it was held in Victoria.

There will be 178 special athletes competing in the following events: 25 meter wheelchair race, 9:30-9:45 a.m.; 50 meter dash, 9:45-10:45 a.m.; 100 meter dash, 10:45-11:15 a.m.; soccer clinic, 11:15-12 p.m.; 400 meter relay and 200 yard shuttle relay, 12-12:30 p.m.; softball throw and frisbee, 12:30-1:30 p.m.; standing long jump and high jump, 2:30-3 p.m.

The olympics will be held at the high school track field. Lunch is scheduled from 12:30-1:30 p.m., and closing ceremonies will begin at 3 p.m.

The Special Olympics is the largest program in the world for sports training and athletic competition for the mentally handicapped. The purpose of the Special Olympics is to contribute to the physical, social and psychological developments of its participants, according to Linda Lipperdt, head coach

of the Eagle Lake Special Olympics team. Area III Special Olympics depends upon the support of concerned citizens, businesses and civic organizations. Records set for Rice

Girls win second in two track meets

Rice high school's girls track team placed second overall in two track and field meets over the weekend. The first meet was held in Sealy on Friday evening, followed by competition in Weimar on Saturday.

Tracy Davis, Terri Clayton, Renea Perdue and Emelda Clayton were teamed in the 400 meter relay and captured second place. The same girls placed second in the 800

meter relay. Also earning second place in the 1600 meter relay were Raiders Veronica Woods, Marsha McTear, Becky Kutzer and Davis.

Emelda Clayton captured first in the 100 meter dash and Terri Clayton was third in the 200.

At the Weimar track meet the same team of Davis, Terri and Emelda Clayton and Perdue won

the 400 and 800 meter relays with record breaking times. They had a time of 49.4 in the 400; the old record was 49.58. A 1:44.51 is the new record for the 800. The girls placed an honorable second in the 1600 meter relay.

In the 100 meter dash, Emelda Clayton placed first and Woods, sixth.

Vicki Darden placed sixth in the 100 meter hurdles. Terri Clayton placed first in the 200 meter dash

followed by teammate Perdue. McTear and Woods, placed second and third, respectively, in the 400 meter dash.

Kutzer placed third in both the 800 meter dash and the 1600 meter dash.

In field events, Davis captured first place in the long jump breaking the old Rice record of 15'10", with 17'5". Teammates McTear and Kutzer placing fifth

and sixth, respectively. In the triple jump, McTear placed second and Rosharon Foster placed third in the discus.

Eighteen teams were present at the meet in Sealy and nine were entered in Weimar. The girls are preparing for the upcoming district meet to be held in Sealy on Friday, April 6. Raider coach is Dollie Johnson.
