## Pilot Club to form Lifeline system

The Pilot Club of Eagle Lake is in the planning stages for establishing a "Lifeline" emergency system for elderly residents, said Nancy Lang, president.

Lifeline is an emergency warning system that is worn by an elderly person to signal the hospital and emergency personnel when in trouble, Lang said. The electronic device is hooked up to their private telephone line and can be transmitted from 200 to 300 feet away.

When the button is pressed, it will activate the base unit at Eagle Lake Community Hospital. Installation will take place in the next couple weeks. Personnel at the hospital will then call the individuals phone number, Lang said. "If there is no response, an ambulance will be dispatched to their home," she said.

The Pilot Club is in the process of receiving a \$1,000 grant from the Pilot International Foundation for the project. It will cost the local chapter \$2,000 for the base unit.

It costs \$500 for the home Lifeline button. Elderly residents that can afford the device are asked to donate the money to the Pilot Club, Lang said. Those unable to afford Lifeline will have systems purchased by the Club and must be in compliance with the following requirements: The person requesting a Lifeline device must live alone and at home, and be unemployed.

The home units are ordered from out of state and are not scheduled to arrive until June or July, Lang said.

The Pilot Club will hold a fund raising project for Lifeline as part of the April Fest activities. Tickets are being sold for a "Grocery Grab." First prize is a two minute shopping spree at Wilcox Minimax. Second prize is a \$25 gift certificate for meat at Minimax.
