Cinco de Mayo important date

Cinco de Mayo, the fifth of May, is an important date in Mexican history. The date is sometimes mistakenly identified as Mexican Independence Day. However, it is the date, in 1852, when a contingent of the Mexican army turned back invading French forces in the Battle of Puebla.

The victory was particularly significant because the Mexicans were greatly outnumbered and poorly equipped, compared to their French foes.

The defeat caused the French to retreat and delayed their ultimate arrival in Mexico City for over a year.

The leader of the Mexican army, General Ignacio Zaragoza, was born near Goliad, when Texas was a part of Mexico.

Cinco de Mayo is a national holiday in Mexico, commemorating the victory at Puebla more than 100 years ago, which continues to be a focal point of national pride.

Just as important is the sense of pride which Texans of Mexican heritage feel for its a link to their past.

For that reason, celebrations are held each Cinco de Mayo in Texas towns and cities with large Hispanic populations. It is a true cause for celebration, and festivities often rival those of September 16, which is Mexican Independence Day.

This is one in a series of Hispanic Heritage Vignettes, prepared by the Good Neighbor Commission of Texas, to increase awareness of the contributions which our state's rich Hispanic heritage has made in the daily lives of all Texans.

Study Club visits Museum of Natural Science, hears informative program on shells

One of the more fascinating and interesting Study Club programs of the year was held in Houston, Wednesday, April 11, 1984 at the Museum of Natural Science.

Dr. T.E. Pulley, curator of Conchology for the Museum, gave an informative talk on shells. Dr. Pulley conveyed his obvious knowledge and love of shells in simple lay terms.

The museum has shells from all parts of the world; however, Dr. Pulley limited his presentation to shells from the Galveston Bay Area. He discussed a few reasons as to why shells from this area are not as beautiful as from other parts of the world:

(1) The extreme variation of water temperatures - hot in summer and cold in winter.

(2) The variation of the salinity of the water in Galveston Bay due to the emptying of the river into the bay.

Dr. Pulley talked about shell collectors - the serious and the amateur collector. The serious collector keeps a record of name, location, and depth of shell in sand. The amateur collector, who does not keep records, but displays and enjoys his shell for their beauty. Dr. Pulley cautioned the group that only shell collections that are accurately recorded may be accepted by the museum.

After Dr. Pulley's presentation Ms. Boone, an assistant in the Conchology Department, conducted a tour for the group through the shell display, the Reference Library where the shells are catalogued, and the Storage Room where literally millions of shells are stored.

Following the tour the group ate lunch at the Museum of Fine Arts Tea Room. After lunch some of the ladies toured the treasures from the Shanghai Museum.

"Recognition of genetic trait leaders, the publishing of the national Simmental sire summary, coupled with corresponding data on growth and maternal traits provide valuable management tools to the cattleman."

An awards program to honor outstanding females in the breed is also maintained. "This program helps the producer identify the superior cow in his herd," Peterson said. "We feel that the cow makes the difference."

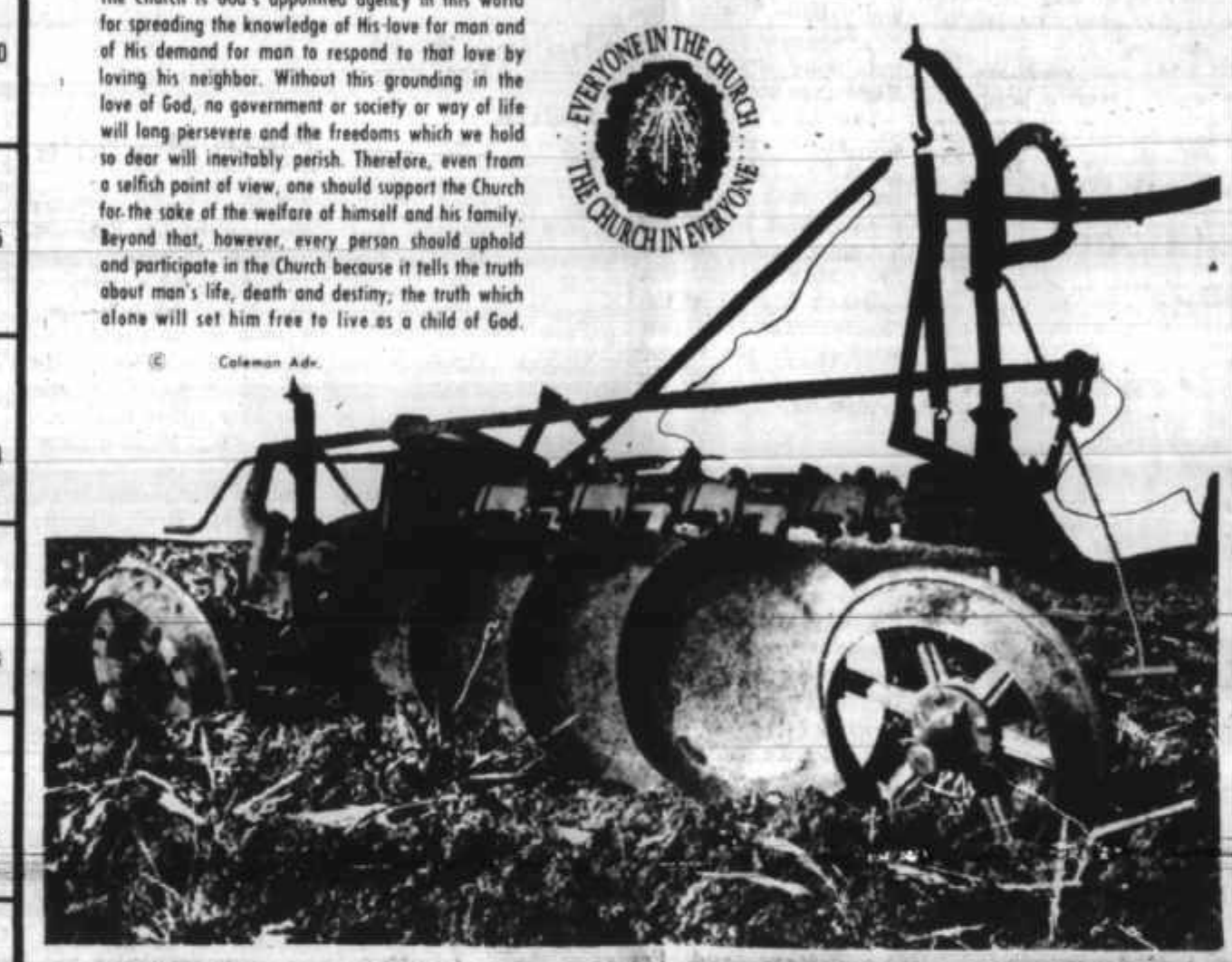
