### City airport board elects Thornton chairman at its first meeting June 1

The Eagle Lake Airport Advisory Board, created by city council on March 13, met for the first time last Friday, June 1, to take care of organizational matters, and begin discussions on the facility.

Dan Thornton was elected chairman. Other board members, appointed by city council, attended the meeting including Ralph Truly, Bob Ashby, Jimmy Thomas, T Lang and Bill Stiles. Billy Joe Williams was unable to attend.

Another meeting is scheduled this Friday, June 8, at 9:30 a.m. in the council meeting room at the municipal building.

Mayor Elmer Struss attended only a portion of the meeting, to "give the group its charge," one member said. On Tuesday, Struss said "It's just an advisory board to advise council...they do the thinking and the planning," he said, then it will be up to council to make any yes-or-no decisions.

Although Struss said he did not give the board specific instructions, he did say its immediate task is to study the Eagle Lake Airport engineering plan prepared by the Texas Aeronautics Commission.

The goal, Struss said, is to get the airport here on the state "recommended" list, so the city would be eligible for some sort of state funds, should council decide to apply for them.

One board member said it's too early to report any of the board's discussions, but added that he already has begun getting telephone calls about the facility. Several years ago there was some discussion by city council concerning expansion at the airport, but no action was taken since residents of the area complained.

Stocker and Feeder Calves and Yearlings: Heavy: Hereford and Angus steer calves, 58 to 65 cents per pound; Hereford and Angus heifer calves, 52 to 56 cents; Crossbred steer calves, 56 to 65 cents; Crossbred heifer calves, 52 to 58 cents; replacement heifers, 57 to 65 cents. Light: Hereford and Angus steer calves, 85 cents to \$1.05; Hereford and Angus heifer calves, 60 to 90 cents; Crossbred steer calves, 85 cents to \$1.05; Crossbred heifer calves, 60 to 90 cents; Light plain calves, 50 to 55 cents.

Sheeps: ewes, 10 to 20 cents per pound; lambs, 30 to 40 cents; bucks 10 to 20 cents; pairs \$25 to \$40 per pair.



### Two arrested for burglary

The June 6 session of the Colorado County grand jury will meet this week to hear the case of two Rock Island men arrested on burglary charges stemming from a March 17 theft from the Clispson Farm near Rock Island.

Sheriff's officers who handled the investigation recovered the truck stolen from the farm on the day of the theft, but the air compressor and rifle taken were not recovered until last Thursday, May 31.

According to Sheriff Jim Broussard, Tana Hudson, 23, was arrested last Thursday, and George Zepeda Jr. was arrested Monday, June 4. Hudson has been released from the Colorado County Jail on \$1,000 bond, but as of Tuesday afternoon, Zepeda was still in jail.

In another investigation, the department said that at 7:51 a.m. last Wednesday, May 30, Arlin Miller of Garwood reported the theft of a 1978 Honda cycle taken from his rice field near FM 333. Miller said the vehicle was seen on May 27, but missing when he returned to the field on May 29.
