24 Years Ago Let's Look Back

The Legislature convened in special session last week to consider whether to raise certain taxes and by how much, to pay for higher teacher salaries, education reforms and state highway construction. Privately, some House members predicted it would take the Legislature close to the full 30 days allowed by the Constitution to enact a new program. Governor Mark White gave lawmakers a formal \$4.8 billion tax package that includes raising the sales tax by one cent, the funds tax by five cents, and taxes on alcohol and tobacco by 20 percent. The increase in the sales tax is heavily opposed by business and industry, and at this point, is probably the most controversial of White's much-discussed tax program. The gasoline tax is the most popular. White opposed closing those sales loopholes because he didn't want his program to become bogged down taking on the powerful special-interests who had the clout to initiate those loopholes.

He also insisted that lawmakers should understand they will probably have to raise taxes again next January when they return in a regular session. He wants the Legislature over the next three years to set aside \$971 million to cushion the 1986-87 budgets. "The hardest part, of course, is to convince the Legislature to leave unspent funds on the table," White said. That particular posture wasn't well received by some lawmakers who favor raising taxes for specific spending needs or not at all. But White assured legislators that a second tax increase won't be necessary.

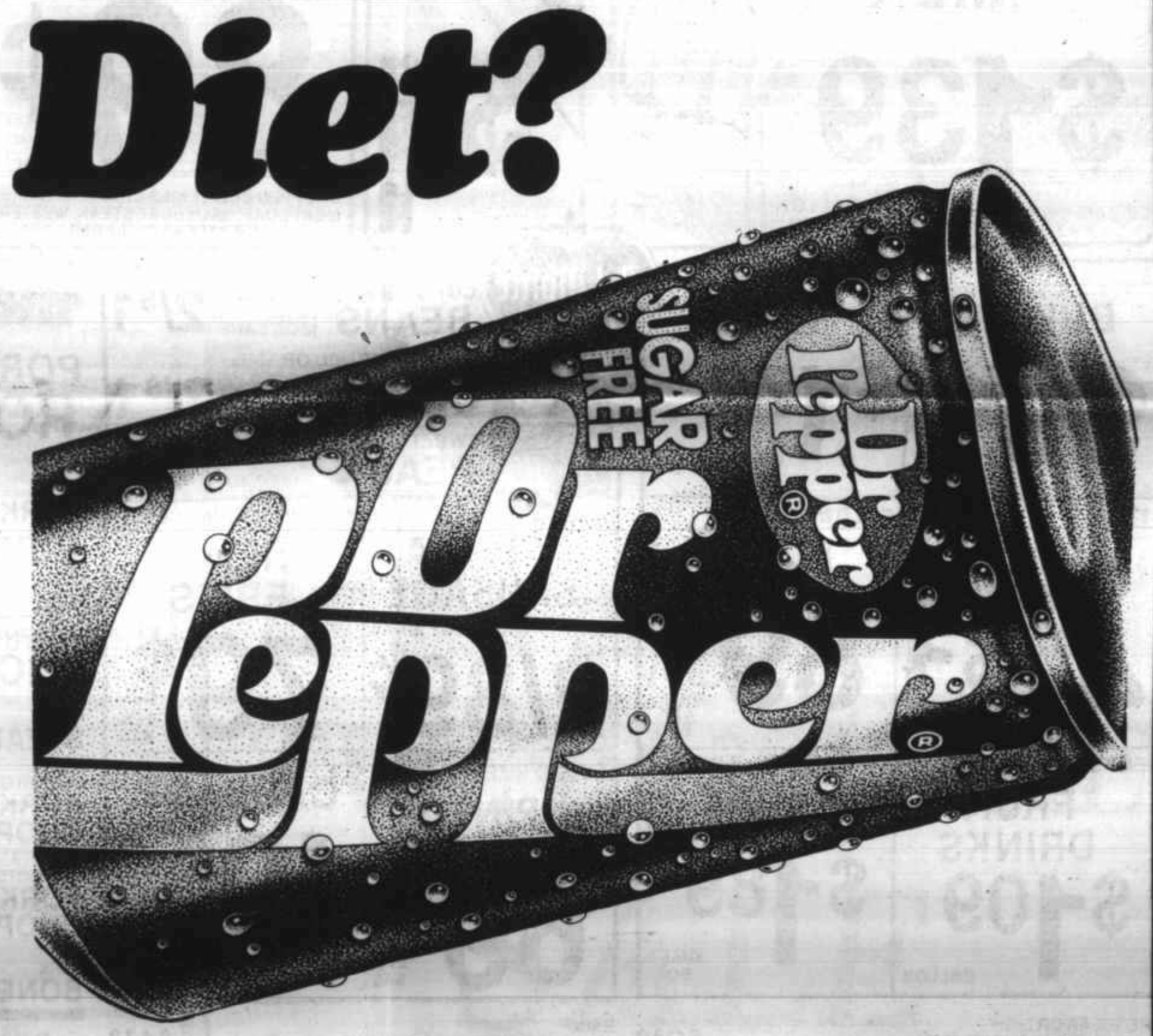
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
