**Conservation when watering lawns saves \$**  
 When the weather turns dry, don't just turn on your lawn sprinkler and then gripe about your high water bill. By watering, fertilizing, and mowing your lawn properly, you can reduce your water bill as much as 40 percent.

Conservation by the homeowner provides the only solution to high water bills and excessive water demands during the hot and usually dry Texas summers. In small cities where industrial demand for water is low, lawn watering may account for as much as half of all the water used during summer months. Even in larger cities, lawns get 30 to 40 percent of all the water supplied by municipalities. Most Texas lawns need about 2 inches of water per week during the summer and most of this usually comes from irrigation. Exactly what can a homeowner do to reduce his summer water bill. The first thing is to water the lawn only when grass starts to show signs of drought stress. Look for discoloration and wilting. If leaves roll up in the late afternoon and footprints remain after walking across the lawn, then water within 24 hours. Once you've decided that your lawn needs watering, do it right. Most homeowners don't water their lawns properly. They either water too often, shallow roots and making it a prime target for insects, diseases and temperature extremes, or they water too infrequently and apply too much water at one time, resulting in a lot of runoff.

When watering, soak the soil to a depth of 4 to 6 inches. In heavy clay soils, watering for 15 to 20 minute periods may be necessary to prevent excessive runoff. Cutting back on lawn fertilization can also reduce watering. Apply fertilizer in the spring and fall to keep the lawn healthy. Fertilizing during the summer, especially with nitrogen fertilizer, will green up the lawn, but

**Dubina noted as first Czech settlement in Texas**  
 Dubina, a small community located between Weimar and Schulenburg on FM 1383, has been designated as the first Czech settlement in Texas by the Texas Historical Commission. A historical marker has been erected in Dubina with the following inscription: "Dubina, which derives its name from the Czech word for Oak Grove, was founded in 1856 by a group of Moravian immigrants, including the Marak, Kahlisch, Sramek, Peter, Holub, Muzny, and Haisdnek families. By 1900 the farming community had erected a church building, mill, cotton gin, blacksmith shop, store, and post office. A 1912 fire caused extensive damage from which the town never recovered. As the first settlement in Texas to be founded entirely by Czech Moravians, Dubina remains an important part of the state's regional and cultural history."
