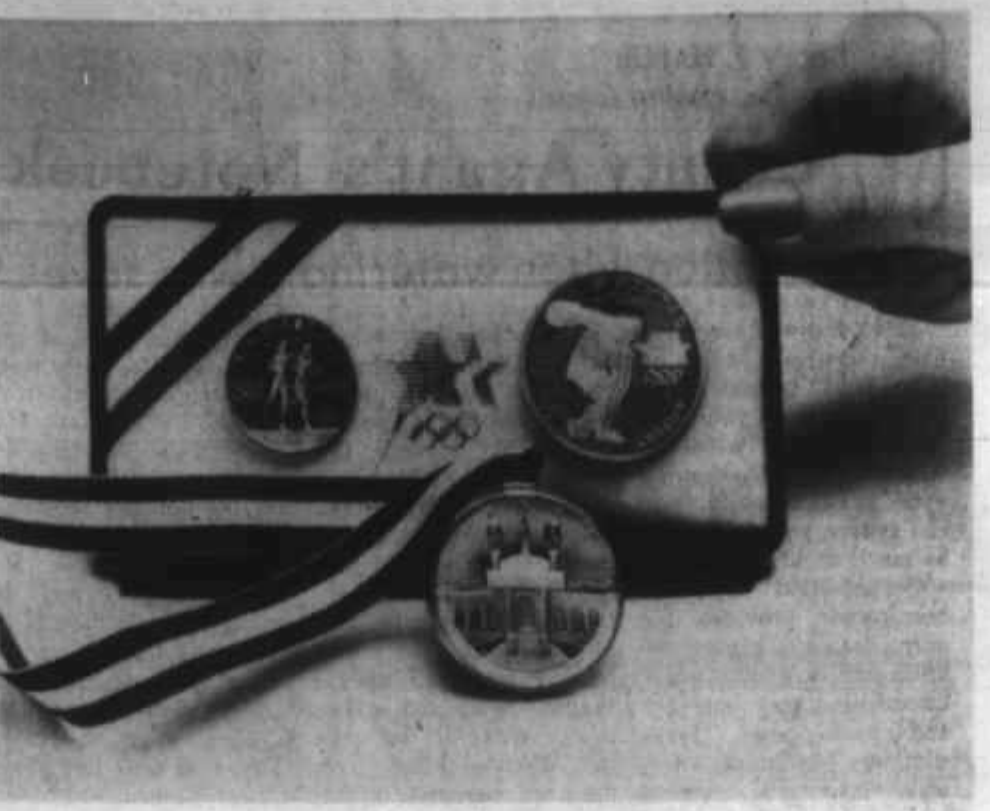

The coins, from left, are the 1984 \$10 gold piece, the 1984 Olympic silver dollar and the 1983 Olympic silver dollar. Coins can be purchased singly or in sets.

First National Bank of Eagle Lake has olympic commemorative coins

The First National Bank of Eagle Lake has joined more than 2,000 banks and Savings and Loans from rural Broken Bow, Nebraska to downtown Miami and suburban Temple, Texas to raise funds for America's Olympic team. The banks are helping the nation's amateur athletes by selling gold and silver Olympic coins (over-the-counter).
The public's initial response to the Treasury's first-ever national coin consignment program has been overwhelmingly positive according to Dean Mitchell, Director of the Olympic Coin Program. Mr. Mitchell reports that the Rayne Bank and Trust Co. in Rayne, Louisiana, sold out their first order of gold and silver coins within hours after the shipment arrived.
Two years ago, Congress passed legislation authorizing the production of the gold and silver Olympic coins to commemorate the 1984 Summer Games in Los Angeles and to raise funds for the nation's Olympic effort. Three coins have been struck, 1983 and 1984 Olympic silver dollars and
