Row Crops Tour June 25

County Agent's Notebook

Colorado County and area corn and grain sorghum producers are invited to attend the eighth annual Row Crops Tour to be held Monday, June 25.

Please return the attendance survey or phone the extension agent at 732-2082 by no later than Friday, June 22 as this information is needed in planning meal arrangements.

The tour, jointly sponsored by the Colorado County Crops Committee in cooperation with the county Extension agent, will begin at 5 p.m. at the Edward Gold farm located on county road 113 approximately 1 1/2 miles west of Garwood. This top will feature a seven variety corn varietal and

disease study test.

The tour will then proceed to the Pat and Norbert Meisner farm located approximately 1 1/2 miles southeast of Garwood on Mansfield Street onto a gravelled county road. Pat Meisner is farming a 19 variety grain sorghum variety and disease study test. Also sorghum will be evaluated.

The tour will then cross the Colorado River and go through the Gracey Plantation located in the Eldridge community view corn being grown by Arthur Mahalite and sons, Kenneth Mahalite and John Mahalite.

While on the Gracey Plantation, stop will be made to discuss the Western Corn Rootworm

situation with pointers on the Western rootworm control being made by Dr. Bart Drees, extension service entomologist.

An additional stop will be made in the same vicinity to view and discuss the growing of Group IV or early maturing soybeans.

The tour will conclude with a barbecue courtesy of area and local agribusiness firms and seed producers. Wives are encouraged to attend.
