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Eagle Lake Headlight

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18 hole golf course shaping up nicely in Frelsburg

A masterfully designed and beautifully executed golf course called The Falls — that includes residential property — already is well shaped into the gentle hills and valleys of northern Colorado County.

Any thought of such a development being out of place in this part of rural Texas are quickly dispelled with a tour of the nearly 700 acre piece of property. The "blue sky" idea that property owner Carl Gulley is making into reality, is being done with sophistication and competence.

When completed, it appears the residents of the county will share the benefit of the multi-million dollar investment, through increased land values adding to the tax rolls.

The Falls includes the 18-hole golf course designed by Jay Riviere, a six-year Colorado County resident of the Cat Spring area, and partner Dave Marr. It will be completed enough for play in November.

Construction on the club house, with non-resident memberships available, will begin this fall with an April completion date. Just this week, architects presented final plans. Tennis and swimming facilities will be built, and to date, more than 60 lots have been sold.

Earlier this year property owner Gulley approached Colorado County Commissioners Court, just to let them know the type of development he was planning, so they could judge their road budgets. At that time, reaction was mild, with an attitude of "seeing is believing."

A visit to the property last Saturday, that began more as a weekend drive, turned into a two-hour personalized tour by one of Gulley's staff, long-time golf pro Art Diette. A later conversation with Riviere revealed just how well planned the development is, and the extent of the care given to its successful completion.

At the present, bulldozers and other land-shaping equipment have done most of their work, so the layout of the course can be visualized. To a layman, viewing bald earth may not show much, since there is very little grass planted yet, but to a golfer, the imagination makes the bright, dry clay and sand some alive with grass.

There is an Eagle Lake connection to this part of the course development, according to Riviere — John Thomas' company in Houston, American Hydro Grass, will be planting some of the grass on the course soon. And for a native touch, Thomas also is planning to sow wild flowers on the course. Thomas has capitalized on the over increasing interest in Texas wildflowers by harvesting their seeds in the spring, for later resale.
