Local students return from citizenship seminar

Temple Thomas of Eagle Lake, Linda Korenek of Garwood, David Wike of Cat Spring, and Roger W. Smith of Weimar attended the Texas Farm Bureau High School Citizenship Seminar, June 18-22 at Angelo State University in San Angelo.

Students who attended the seminar and are members of Farm Bureau families will be eligible to enter the TFB Free Enterprise Speech Contest this year. Contestants also must make at least five speeches concerning free enterprise between the end of the seminar and September 21.

One speech contestant from each of the 15 TFB districts will be selected to compete in the state semi-finals at the TFB annual meeting set for November 22-26 in San Antonio. Six contestants will advance to compete in the contest finals. A state winner and one runner-up will then be chosen.

District winners will each be awarded a \$750 college scholarship. The state winner will receive a \$2,000 college scholarship, the state runner-up will receive a \$1,500 college scholarship and each of the four finalists will receive a \$1,000 college scholarship.

Contestants who win scholarships in more than one TFB contest in the same year will be awarded the largest scholarship. Only one scholarship can be won during the same year.

Contestants winning scholarships will not receive cash. The scholarship is payable directly to the college or university in two equal payments. The certificate (scholarship) will be mailed to all winners following the state contest.
