Enchanted Rock State Natural Area reopening draws thousands

More than 24,000 visitors poured into the Enchanted Rock State Natural Area between Llanos and Fredericksburg during April to enjoy the 400-foot-tall granite boulder and new facilities at the site. The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department reopened the facility on March 30 after two years of renovation and construction to park facilities. Of the total visitation, 2,034 stayed overnight at newly-constructed campsites. The park's telephone number is (915) 247-3903. Park officials said also that Guadalupe River State Park, which opened June 3, 1983, was visited by 122,783 persons through April 30, with 23,235 staying overnight. No official attendance figures are available as yet for the state's newest park. Brazos Bend south of Houston, but officials say the facility has been extremely popular so far and probably will host 500,000 visitors in its first year of operation. Bill West, new water resource director for Lower Colorado River Authority

Bill West, a 14-year veteran of LCRA water and power operations, is the new water resource director for the Lower Colorado River Authority. West's appointment was announced Thursday (June 28) by LCRA General Manager Ed Soderberg. The appointment became effective July 1.

As water resource director, the 37-year-old West will coordinate all of LCRA's water-related activities, including those associated with the Authority's new water policy.

That policy, adopted June 19 by LCRA's board of directors, directs LCRA to take the initiative in planning for and coordinating water needs and projects in the Authority's 10-county statutory district.

The appointment is in effect an extension of West's current duties. West, currently LCRA's operations manager, has been involved in LCRA water activities since he joined the Authority in June 1970.

"It will be a tough task, because we really don't know at this time the true scope of the nature of the job," said West. "It's an evolutionary process, as we intend to talk with folks throughout our district and determine what their needs and desires are before we develop any specific projects or programs."

West said the LCRA will develop a long-range program for all of its district's water needs. "We're just not getting in
