The market this week was again stronger on most stocker calves. Large runs in our area have brought in some new buyer interest, according to George Hagan and Don McAllister.

Cattle on hand, 1289; hogs, 10; sheep, 8; horses, 3.

Stocker Cows: higher dressing utility and cutter cows, 33 to 37.50 cents per pound; lower dressing utility and cutter cows, 29 to 33 cents; lightweight canner cows, 25 to 29 cents.

Packer Butts: heavy weight, 45 to 49 cents per pound; utility and cutter, 41 to 45 cents; lightweight canner, 37 to 41 cents.

Butcher Calves and Yearlings: good to choice, 55 to 59 cents per pound; standard, 50 to 55 cents; utility, 44 to 50 cents.

Stocker Cows: good stocker cows and heifers \$300 to \$400;

commercial and medium stocker cows and heifers, \$250 to \$300; good cow and calf pairs, \$500 to \$550; medium cow and calf pairs, \$425 to \$500; common cow and calf pairs, \$325 to \$425.

Hogs: No. 1 hogs, 54 to 55 cents per pound; No. 2 and 3, 50 to 54 cents; feeder pigs and shoats, 60 to 85 cents per pound; sows, 42 to 47.50 cents.

Sheep: ewes, 8 to 15 cents per pound; lambs, 30 to 40 cents; bucks, 8 to 15 cents; pairs \$25 to \$40 per pair.
