starts work this week. He is married and they have an 8-year-old daughter. The city does not plan to fill the other vacancy, leaving the city with three patrolmen and a chief, which is the same staffing as Columbus.

Council also agreed to send Klockman to a three-day insurance seminar. Councilman Mike Duarte said that since the city spends as much as \$55,000 on insurance, it would be wise for the city to know as much about it

as possible. Klockman also reported that the state department of highways was talking with the Southern Pacific railroad on establishing a better right of way for FM 102 along Post Office St. There have been no decisions made, but possibilities include some curb and gutter installation.

Council also learned that Paul Supak, a city employee, has been serving for several months as president of the Guadalupe Valley Water Association.
