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Burke is Texas ASA-Lexone young leader

G. Roswell (Rozzie) Burke III of El Campo has been named winner of the Texas ASA-Lexone young leader award for 1984.

Burke and his wife, Mary, will receive an expense-paid trip to the American Soybean Association annual convention at Tulsa from August 3 to 6.

Sponsor of the trip is DuPont Agricultural Chemicals, maker of "Lexone" herbicide. The national awards program is administered by ASA; winners in 26 soybean producing states are picked by each state soybean association.

Burke farms 3,500 acres of which 2,000 to 2,500 are in rotation systems including soybeans, rice, corn, milo. Last year he planted 600 acres of soybeans using conventional tillage methods. This year he plans to plant 480 acres. His crop average is 30 to 32 bushels of beans per acre.
