**Eagle Lake field day July 5**

The new high yielding, storm resistant, semi-dwarf rice varieties will be featured at the "10th Annual Field Day" at Eagle Lake. Tours will begin at 5:30 p.m. on July 5, at the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station located northwest of Eagle Lake on Highway 102.

The new semi-dwarf varieties increased yields 1,000 pounds per acre last year and are being grown on 25 percent of Texas' acreage this year. A panel of semi-dwarf farmers will discuss their experiences on how to best grow these new varieties. Dr. Art Gerlow, Extension Economist will discuss the "1984 Rice Market Outlook."

Second crop production research will be discussed by Dr. Turner and Dr. McCauley. Rice disease control which is even more important with semi-dwarf varieties will be discussed by Dr. Whitney. Dr. Bowers will discuss soybean research designed to reduce risk and escape the effects of early summer drought periods. Dr. Bollich will be discussing the new potential semi-dwarf varieties that are earlier-maturing.

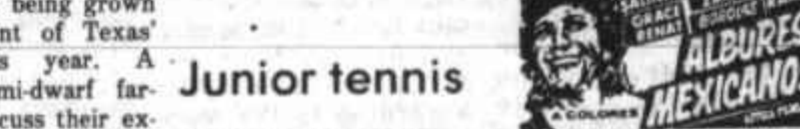

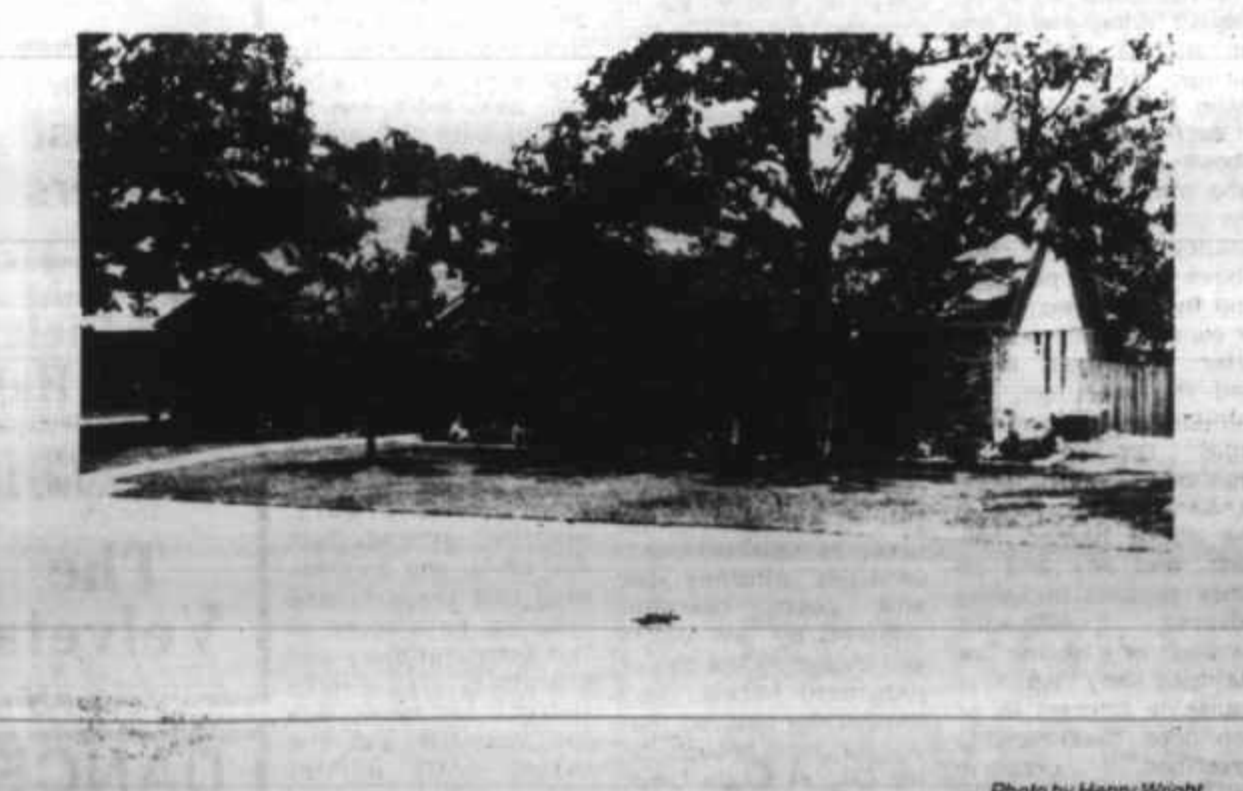
