Rice High School sets date for 1985-86 pre-registration

Pre-registration dates have been set for all students who will be attending Rice High School for the 1985-86 school year.

Counselors will be distributing information sheets to students which will explain the requirements for graduation, courses of study to be offered for the 1985-86 school year, and suggested courses to be taken at each grade level.

Parents should review these information sheets with their child prior to the pre-registration date for their child. Parents who may have questions concerning pre-registration should contact the Rice High School counselors at 234-3535.

Pre-registration will be conducted at the high school for those students in grades 9, 10 and 11 on February 7, 8 and 9. Pre-registration will be made during the English class period. Parents who would like to attend the pre-registration sessions may do so.

Students in the eighth grade will have pre-registration sessions at 7 p.m. Students attending Eagle Lake Middle School will have their pre-registration session on Monday, February 11. Students at Sheridan school will pre-register on Tuesday, February 12. Eight grade students need to have parents accompany them at the pre-registration sessions. Students who are attending St. Mary's School in Nada and who will be attending Rice High School next year, need to attend the Garwood school pre-registration session.

Students planning to attend a four-year college after graduation from high school should not plan on taking P.O.M., Consumer Math, and/or Pre-Algebra math courses. Most four-year colleges require Algebra I and higher math courses to meet entrance requirements. Many four-year colleges also require two-years of a foreign language. Most junior colleges will accept math courses below Algebra I level for entrance and do not require a foreign language. Students planning to enter college or a trade school after graduation from high school should check with their counselor for the specific entrance requirements of the college or trade school they are planning to attend.

Student (and parents) are encouraged to seek assistance from counselors in the planning and up-date of their four-year plan of studies to be sure they are meeting all of the requirements for graduation and to meet their needs for post-high school education and training. Students should check periodically with their counselor for any changes that need to be made in the four-year plan of studies. Counselors receive news letters from trade schools and colleges weekly to keep abreast of the many changes taking place in post-high school programs.

Parents are always welcome to visit with counselors to discuss their child's progress, planning post-high school education and training opportunities, planning financial assistance for post-high school education and training, and for scholarships.
