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Four to participate in regional free-throw competition

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Sheriff's Report

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During the year 1984, the Sheriff's Department issued 1711 traffic citations. At an average of \$30 per citation, this is approximately \$51,130 collected for the county. The Sheriff's office also checked 224 places for a total of 3828 checks made. These property checks are made by officers on routine patrol at no extra expense to the taxpayers.

In addition to working school traffic in the mornings and afternoons, here is the report for the week of 1-27 through 2-2: 1-27-85: checked on a theft near Columbus; checked on a suspicious subject east of Columbus.
