Lose to Gonzales by one

Rice boys still contenders

GONZALES — Every loss in sports is a heartbreaker for the losing team, but the 63-62 loss by the Rice Raiders to now 7-0, state-ranked Gonzales here Tuesday night was a nerve-wringer.

Rice girls win district

The Rice Lady Raiders clinched the District 26-AAA girls basketball title in the Rice gym Tuesday night by defeating the Gonzales Apaches 46-39. Gonzales came into the game with an awesome 22-3 season record, but Rice led throughout the game to set its season mark at 15-4 and remain undefeated (9-0) in district play.

After completing the regular season on Friday night, the Lady Raiders move into the state playoffs with the bi-district game to be played on the 14th, 15th or 16th of February against the loser of the Fluverville-Elgin matchup to be played Friday.

The Lady Raiders were 15-6 on the season and 8-0 in conference play going into Tuesday night's game against Gonzales. And the Rice girls were guaranteed a spot in the state playoffs before the Gonzales contest.

In posting the two victories last week, coach Mike Tankersley's Lady Raiders defeated Hallettsville 70-39 on Tuesday night and the Rice girls won over Bonus Lease in a game played at Columbus, 62-24.

Top scorer for Rice in the Tuesday game with Hallettsville, Lakeshia Jackson scored 13 points. Veronica Woods added 11 and Karen Bluntson scored 10 points.

In the Friday night game at Columbus, Jackson again scored 13 points, Woods hit for 10 points and Bluntson added 11.

protected their lead in District 26-AAA standings. Gonzales led all the way, but the Raiders got within striking distance several times in the thrilling last few moments of the contest.

Gonzales led 16-11 at the end of the first period, 28-23 at halftime and 50-41 at the close of the third period.

Donald Ray Spears hit for 26 big points in the game. Dabney had 12 and Dennis Hemphill added 10 to lead the scoring for the Raiders.

Rice meets Edna here Friday and closes the season Tuesday of next week at Yoakum. A victory for Rice in both the remaining games will put the Raiders in the state playoffs.

The Rice junior varsity defeated the Gonzales junior varsity, 57-56, in an overtime game Tuesday night and the Rice freshman team remained undefeated for the season, whipping Gonzales' freshmen, 58-38.

Going into this week's games in District 26-AAA, Gonzales leads the standings with an undefeated 6-0 mark and the Gonzales cagers are ranked fifth in the state in 3-A; Rice was 5-2; Edna was 4-2; Columbus was 3-4; and Hallettsville and Yoakum were each 1-5.

Rice defeated Edna in the first-round game, 57-48, but the Raiders lost to Gonzales in the first round, 64-59, at the Rice gym.

In games last week, the Raiders defeated Hallettsville 77-71 on Tuesday and came back Friday night to defeat the Columbus Cardinals 61-58. Columbus had won over Rice in the first-round district contest, 62-52.

In the game Tuesday of last week, Hallettsville led at the close of the first period, 21-24; Rice was out front at halftime, 43-35; and the Raiders were leading 57-52 at the close of the third period of play.

Rice edged Hallettsville 20-19 in scoring the final period.

Donald Ray Spears was Rice's top scorer in the contest with 24 points. Dennis Hemphill scored 21 points, Nelson Dabney added 13, Malcom Thomas scored 12 points and

James Williamson added eight points for the Raiders. In the game Friday night, Rice led during the first three quarters, but Columbus tied the game at 45-45 early in the fourth quarter when D. Moeller hit a field goal.

Columbus scored 13 unanswered points in the third period and Rice had turnover galore during the quarter, based mostly because the Cardinals went into a full-court press. Rice finally adjusted and went on to score the victory.

Rice was ahead 14-8 after the first quarter, 31-26 at halftime and the Raiders were leading 45-43 at the close of the third quarter.

Rice scored 16 points to 15 for Columbus the fourth period to set the final score, Rice 61, Columbus 58.

Dabney was the game's top scorer with 21 points, Spears had 14, Hemphill scored 12, Williamson and Thomas had six points apiece and Gary Spates added two points.

Moeller was the top scorer for the Cardinals with 16 points. Percy Waddie added 13 and C. Edwards had 12 points. This loss to Rice was the third in a row for the Cards and they have been virtually eliminated from playoff competition.

Rice Frosh win The Rice freshmen boys basketball team defeated Hallettsville on Tuesday last week 79-36 to put the Rice freshmen at nine wins, no losses for the season.

The Rice cagers held Hallettsville to just 28 points in the first half and the hosts could manage only 10 points the second half.

Coach Steve Carroll said it was the Rice frosh's best defensive performance of the year. The Rice freshmen have won each game this year by a lopsided score, however.

Curt McTear led all scorers in the game as he hit 27 points for the winners. All the remaining freshmen on the team — Kevin Long, Mario Pope, Douglas Tillman, Jeff Marquart, Derrick Stevens and Marcus Wilson contributed heavily to the Rice frosh effort.

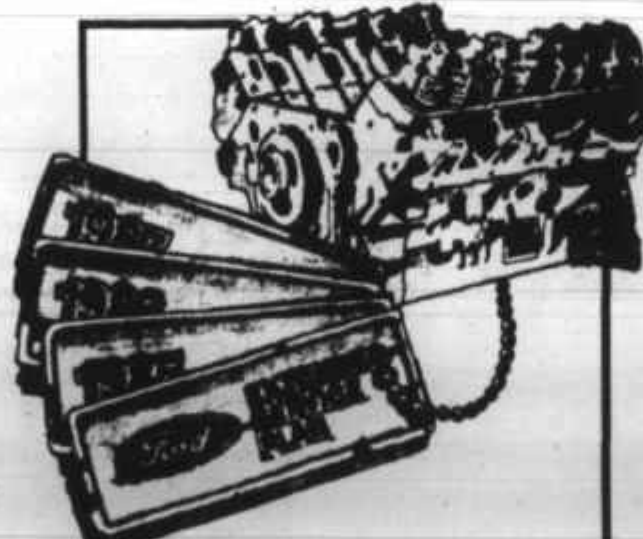
