Sixteen Colorado County students, including seven members of the Rice High School FFA chapter, are scheduled to participate in the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo set to open this weekend. Five members of the Weimar FFA and four members of the Colorado County 4-H Club are participating.

Also David Eastley, 15, of Eagle Lake, Dewight Dopalauf of Sheridan and Bryan Janak of Weimar will participate in calf scrambles. Eastley and Janak will be in the scramble on February 25 and Dopalauf on February 26.

The Rice FFA members and the animals they will show are: Phillip Huvor, beef heifer and beef scramble; Wade Miller, Darrell Pegel and Daryl Piepryca, market steers; Travis Richter and Cleve Scott, market barrows, and Tara Stephens, beef heifer. From the 4-H Club, Stuart Beken, market steer and beef heifer; Brandy Heinsohn, beef heifer; Keith Hudec, market steer; Christine Koehl, market barrow, and Gene Miles, market steer. Altogether, 16,313 junior show entries, 8,900 open show entries and 3,011 horse show entries are expected this year. The Houston Livestock Show, considered the world's largest, holds competition on one level for FFA and 4-H members in Texas, and on another level for professional breeders and ranchers throughout the world.

The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo also is the largest donor of agricultural scholarships in the nation. The show currently has 885 students on scholarships and annually com-

Bud Seaholm in Houston rodeo

Top Pro Rodeo Cowboy and native of Eagle Lake, Bud Seaholm, is once again expected to be among the top competitors at this year's 1985 Houston Rodeo. The competition begins Wednesday, February 20 and will continue through Sunday, March 3. Bud is the son of Gardner Seaholm of Eagle Lake.

Unfortunately, Bud was seriously injured last year at the Houston Rodeo during the bareback riding event on the horse Orphan Annie. Upon completion of the mandatory eight second ride, as he was preparing to dismount, the horse apparently stumbled and tripped, causing it to flip over in mid air resulting in trapping Seaholm underneath. The diagnosis was a snapped ligament in his left knee which required orthopedic surgery along with hours of extensive rehabilitation therapy.

Bud reports that he feels good but is still some distance from being 100 percent recovered. As an active participant for all around honors, Seaholm works both the bareback riding and steer wrestling events, in which excellent physical as well as mental condition is a must.

Having previously been classified as semi-retired, meaning he competes in approximately 10 to 15 rodeos per year, the nature of this knee injury has forced him to cutback even further. This year he plans to enter only the Denver, Colorado; El Paso, Texas; Ft. Worth, Texas; San Antonio, Texas; Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and Houston, Texas rodeos.

The Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA) headquartered in Colorado Springs, Colorado, has received official word that upon completion of this year's Houston rodeo, which makes Bud's 11th year as a veteran pro rodeo cowboy, he will hang up his spurs and join the ranks of the fully retired. At the age of 35, Bud is presently employed as a plant manager for Pioneer Concrete and lives in Houston.

County to evaluate staff, equipment

A hearing to establish a 30-MPH speed limit on a portion of Gold Road west of Garwood, and a notice to department heads on staff and equipment evaluation, were two of several actions Colorado County commissioners took Monday at their regular meeting.

The speed limit hearing will be held at 10 a.m. Monday, March 11. If not contested, the limit will be placed on the portion of road serving several homes.

There was little discussion about the evaluation project. Commissioners simply adopted a resolution asking each official to evaluate personal needs and equipment requirements by May 1. County Judge Crank said one reason for the request was to help with budgeting later this year.

Commissioners also approved the only bid submitted for a new transmitting tower on the county jail, and approved a bid for a new building for the precinct in the Weimar area.

The tower bid was from Supasch's Communications Inc. of East Bernard. Removal of the old tower will cost \$90 per hour, with an estimated 10 hours needed, and the bid for the new tower was \$14,075. Commissioner Bill Siles voted against the bid, and suggested commissioners should have sought other bids. Commissioners said they felt ample time was given for other bidders to respond, and that Webb Electronics of Eagle Lake had been asked to help draw up specifications, but had not responded.

The bid for a new transmitting tower was submitted for a bid for a used machine. The low bid submitted was about \$50,000 for an International donor from Plains Machinery. It is a used machine, tested, and had about 1,700 hours use on it. Fogle Equipment of Houston, represented at the meeting by Lewis Epps of Eagle Lake, said they had no used equipment to offer, but bid a new Flat-Allie unit for \$29,500.
