Spinal screening program in March

Spinal screening for the fifth and eighth grade students of Rice CISD will be done in March. Early detection of idiopathic scoliosis in school children can prevent serious deformity. It allows early treatment by conservative means and, in most cases, eliminates the need for major surgery for this deformity.

Scoliosis is a lateral curvature of the spine. Normally the spine curves forward and out, in scoliosis, it also bends from side to side, it is a progressive disease which can lead to pain, crippling and cardiopulmonary and other complications. Scoliosis usually develops rapidly during the early adolescent growth period.

In states where a scoliosis detection program has been in effect for several years, progressive deformity due to idiopathic scoliosis has virtually disappeared among school children.
