Specific objectives of the 4-H horse program are these:

1. To acquire skills in horse management by owning a horse or pony and being responsible for it.
2. To appreciate riding as recreation.
3. To learn horsemanship skills and understanding breeding, training and raising horses as a business.
4. To acquire safety skills to prevent injury to persons and animals.
5. To promote love for and humane treatment of animals.
6. To develop sportsmanship, cooperation, decision-making ability and public speaking skills through participation in demonstrations, tours, judging and exhibits.
7. To help with horse projects can compete at various horse shows held annually and can qualify for district and state competition. Those who excel in the project can qualify for the American Quarter Horse Association.

Homemaker's Reflections

Where are your valuable papers?

Important money matters—insurance, savings, investments, real estate—create lots of paperwork. Once you sign those papers you may forget about them, and then when you need them the most they may be nowhere to be found.

It's just good household management to periodically take inventory of your valuable papers. It will help you locate the papers when they are needed, direct someone else to the source of emergency and evaluate your financial affairs on a routine basis.

Prepare an inventory of valuable documents on paper or your home computer. Review it at least once a year and update it whenever important changes occur.

You might also want to prepare an inventory for an older relative, since you could be the person who needs to locate his or her important papers.

An inventory could include the following categories:

—A family record listing names, birth dates and where the birth is recorded for each family member.

—The name, address and telephone number of persons who should be notified in case of serious emergency.

—The name, address and telephone number of a person to whom you have given power of attorney.

—Information concerning social security, retirement, pension, and profit sharing plans. Dates of employment and employers are frequently needed for filing applications and settling estates.

—A list of money owed, and owed to you, size of debt and terms of payment.

—The location of your valuable papers including wills and instructions, personal papers, property papers and real estate papers.
