Survey shows teacher support for new extracurricular rules

A survey of teachers attending the fifth annual convention of the Association of Texas Professional Educators (ATPE) revealed that more than half of the respondents support the controversial new "no pass, no play" rule governing extracurricular activities participation.

The rule is part of House Bill 72, a sweeping education reform package passed last summer by the Texas Legislature that has taken Texas public schools by storm.

Approximately 400 of the 1000 delegates attending the convention responded to the Fort Worth Star-Telegram survey. Nearly 71 percent favored the new rule, which requires students to pass all courses with a grade of at least 70 in order to participate in extracurricular activities.
