WHAT IS ROOT CANAL?

Years ago, a badly infected tooth was doomed to be pulled. Today, that's a last resort. Root canal treatment consists of: 1) the removal of the infected pulp that lies within the root canal of the tooth, and 2) the sealing of the root ends to prohibit any further infection.

The pulp is the tooth's center core of soft tissue (nerves, blood vessels and fibers). When the dental restorer "cure" from a tooth, he really removes pulpal tissue that contains the nerve.

Removing the pulp from the tooth does not produce a "dead" tooth. It will be very much alive and functioning.

EER and SEER tell you how much cool air the system will deliver in relation to the amount of electricity needed to run it. Each unit's efficiency rating number is specified in an Electric Energy Guide tag. Check the tags carefully—then head straight for the eight for comfort and savings.

get the rooms and personnel. Sup. King told the board he was making no moves to implement such a program, because the district could purchase equipment it won't need.

Roof settlement on hold

The district's legal counsel, attorney from Victoria, told the board that even though some of the high school roof was not installed according to specifications, he would not recommend taking the contractor, a large Fort Worth firm, to court. Nearly two years ago, the school board hired a roofing consultant, and an architect, to prepare specifications and watch over construction of what they planned as a first-class roof. Their goal was to replace the constantly-leaking roof on the 12-year-old school.

However, the half-million dollar job turned-out to be something other than what the board thought it was purchasing, and the water continues to pour into certain parts of the school. The district has paid about \$400,000 of the bill, and the attorney recommended it pay only another \$200,000 of the remaining \$100,000 due. Since the roof drains installed by Drymalla Construction of Columbus, are leaking, as well as some of the windows, the board said it would wait another month before giving the attorney the go-ahead to negotiate a settlement with the contractor.

Principal reports show needs

The campus reports on this school year pointed out positive aspects of the year, as well as problems.

For instance, at the Eagle Lake Middle School, principal Charles Abel said testing of the eighth grade class shows, on the average, that students are increasing their reading, math and language arts education twice as fast as can be expected. The pool will be open to the public on May 28 and will close about August 17 and will be open by reservations only from August 18 through August 31.

The prices will remain the same as last year: \$30 for one person for a pre-season pass; \$55 for two person pre-season pass; \$75 for three or more pre-season pass; or \$2 daily rate fee for each person. Two preschoolers are free with one paying adult swimmer. Reservations are \$30 minimum for up to 20 people plus lifeguard. After May 27, \$10 will be added to the above pre-season pass. Tickets are available at A.J. Struss Auto Supply.

Scheduled hours: 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. Red Cross or private lessons; 11 a.m. to noon, special or reservations; noon to 1 p.m. lunch; 1 to 6 p.m., open to public; 6 to 9 p.m., special or reservations. The pool will be closed Sundays and Mondays.
