Chamber seeks to influence Southwestern Bell

Members of the Chamber of Commerce hope to influence a decision Southwestern Bell Telephone might be making in regards to Eagle Lake, according to a motion approved Monday by the board of directors.

Chamber president Don Bandy explained that it appears the telephone company is researching various areas to help them outline future capital expenditures, including whether or not to replace the old switching equipment here with modern, electronic switching that would provide touch-tone telephone service.

Of course the new equipment probably would end up costing us more money, Bandy said, but he suggested the chamber take some action to help influence the company. The new equipment would be one more positive fact the chamber and Industrial Foundation could use in attracting new businesses. The new equipment could provide business with better long distance computer links, he said.

The chamber approved a motion to seek signatures on a petition to the company asking for the new equipment. A petition committee was appointed, chaired by John Fearing. Members are Becky Anderson, Doris Thomas, Kate Spangler, Russell Thomas and Bandy.

Monday, Fearing contacted Paul Johnson, community relations manager for SWB in this area, and invited him to speak to a meeting here of interested persons. He agreed, and will research Bell's plans, and be able to answer questions. The date will be announced.

Other reports made at Monday's meeting, held this month at the Longhorn Restaurant, included discussion of insurance, the recent chamber-sponsored sale, and membership.

The sale, held June 8, was very successful for Jo Ann's, Gifts of Distinction, and the Kid's Corner, and brought in extra business for some others. Bandy said the insurance policy that covered the merchants for the sale now has expired and that he is looking into another policy that will give the cham-

ber broad coverage so other events are covered as well.

Bruce Hicks, membership chairman, said that about 50 businesses in the area have been targeted as possible members. They will be contacted in the near future.

Dr. Russell Thomas, reporting for the health committee, said Eagle Lake Community Hospital was embarking on a marketing campaign. Because

of new federal medicare payment regulations, some small hospitals are facing financial problems. Thomas said the hospital here, while in good financial condition at this point, wants to make sure it remains in a solid financial position in the future.

Clady Gehlke and others were commended for their successful completion of the annual Chamber barbecue held on

Memorial Day. Profit from the 517 tickets sold helps the chamber finance operations. Fred Franks was lauded for his dedication to the chicken barbecue. He was assisted by Thomas, Jeff Franks and others.

Next month's meeting will be on July 15 at Anna Lee's Kitchen. Reservations are necessary. Lunch will be \$6 and dessert will be 50-cents.
