Police, firemen busy

Officers from four law enforcement agencies visited several bars here Saturday night checking liquor licenses and in some cases the identification of some patrons. Two men were arrested for public intoxication and orders will be sought to close one location.

In other police and fire reports during the week, disaster was averted at Robinson's Reclaiming yard when the engine and cab of a Lake Oil gasoline tanker truck caught on fire.

The routine checks of the bars was done by three Eagle Lake police officers, state Alcohol Beverage Control officer Al Holland, three sheriff's deputies and Buddy Mills, state game warden. Wardens are licensed peace officers.

Chief Ben Johnson said they visited Stephenson's Cafe, the Jazz Room, El Serrano, Lou's Cafe, Belmar's Lounge, and the game room in the 900 block of East Main. At Stephenson's, Johnson said one patron fied, but later was caught by police. A warrant charging driving a police officer was issued for Timothy Weeks, 20, of Eagle Lake.

At the Game Room, across from the Furniture Shoppe, bartender Alfred Saucedo was cited for public intoxication, Johnson said. He also said the ABC was seeking a hearing to revoke the establishment's license. At El Serrano, Yorktown resident Israel Alvarez, 19, was cited for public intoxication.

The 4 p.m. fire at Robinson's last Thursday was caused either by fuel in the engine compartment of the tanker or an electrical short, the fire department report said. The fire caused severe damage to the motor and wiring, as well as damage to the inside and outside of the cab.

Firemen were on the scene only for 30 minutes. They said the end of the gasoline tank near the cab was heated quite a bit. The truck was parked near one of the large oxygen tanks, but did not spread.

On June 10, firemen responded to a blaze in New Town that destroyed a home owned by Lillie Parker, and occupied by Mildred Williams, on Old Altair Road. By the time firemen reached the scene, the roof already had collapsed onto the foundation and the building could not be saved. They said the fire started when trash was being burned without a receptacle.
