## Rotarians honor Pustejovsky, hear Sen. Caperton

revolutionized education in Texas, he said the house leaders made "a mistake" by not doing the same. "It is indeed a failure of this session that we did not address it," he said in reference to last year's educational legislation. One change the Senate approved but which received no action in the house was to allow the state education agency to interpret the no pass-no play rule for a period of less than six weeks. That's not very long in our adult lives, Caperton said, but it is eternity to a student. He said he felt six weeks was too long and too much punishment, rather an incentive.

"I think it is good education that lets the state say that before they participate they have to improve in the classroom. When they are adults we are going to ask them to pass and measure up. I still think the state board has the discretion to interpret that bill at less than six weeks," Caperton said.

He also said he felt the "career ladder bonus plan" was good for teachers.

Caperton pointed out that even though the session started with a budget recommendation that higher education be cut 25 percent, the legislators managed to adopt a state budget that restored those cuts. "It wasn't without pain," Caperton said. Tuition will increase, but instead of ranking 48th for what it charges students to go to school, it will rank 46th next year after the increase.

## Crime Stoppers receives donations

Eagle Lake Crime Stoppers, Inc., met twice last week to adopt a charter governing operation of the program. It is designed to provide funds to police to be used as reward money.

Friday afternoon at a meeting attended by 10 people at the police station, John Perry of Coastal Contracting was named chairman. Following a format suggested by the state organization, the size of the board, officers and committees were discussed. The group agreed that it will file for non-profit corporation status with the Texas Secretary of State, and the Internal Revenue Service.

Others attending the meeting were John Brasher, First National Bank; Joe Duncan, Duncan & Son; Bobby Johnson, Phillip Soto; Mike Duarte, John McKee; Vera Reeves, John Fearing and police chief Ben Johnson. Alex Woolridge, and Harry and Helen Supak also have been invited to serve on the board.

The board will include 10 to 15 members with a chairman, vice-chairman, secretary and treasurer to serve for two years, starting July 1. The group will meet again July 16 at the Sportsman's Restaurant to hear Greg MacAleese, who was Texas program coordinator for Crime Stoppers in 1984, and originated Crimestoppers in New Mexico more than five years ago.

The executive committee will be the four officers and Bobby Johnson, who was elected Friday as the board member-at-large. Chief Johnson will be the police liaison member.

Explaining how the program works, Chief Johnson said a new telephone number would be installed that can be answered only by the chief as "Crimestoppers," not as the police department. The number would assign a number to the informant, and only that number used in future contacts. When the board decides to pay the informant, one board member will be given the

reward money, and when the informant contacts Johnson, he tells him or her to go to that board member for the money.

To start the Crimestoppers fund, the newly-formed board is asking the public to make contributions. Contributions should be mailed or delivered to the bank, P.O. Box 215, Eagle Lake, 77454, where an account has been established.

Last week sheriff Jim Broussard made a \$100 personal contribution, and another \$100 was donated by a local company. Other members of the board are Mike Duarte, vice chairman; Vera Reeves, secretary, and John Brasher, treasurer.
