Museum Notes

On Wednesday afternoon, July 18, the Prairie Edge Museum fulfilled another reason for being an important part of our community. Twenty-four boys and girls from the Summer Reading Program at the Wintemann Library enjoyed a visit to the museum. They enjoyed slides shown by Rollin Baker and being able not only to see petrified wood and fossils but also to touch them. One very interesting specimen from our community is a petrified tortoise. Mr. Baker pointed out many other objects in the display cases, and such centers of interest as the simulated blacksmith shop. The youngsters were accompanied by librarian Becky Mills and Gene Brown who transported the group in one of the school buses. We hope all of these visitors will return soon and bring their Moms, Dads, and other family members and friends with them.

Another display case is now ready for you to see and enjoy. This display honors the memory of the late Thomas T. Waddell, game warden and conservationist. He was commissioned Game and Fish Warden in Texas in 1930. The case includes pictures, newspaper articles, field notes and citations, one of which is of his having been inducted into the South Central Texas Semi-Pro Baseball Hall of Fame. Mr. Waddell, as many of you know, played a large part in the establishment of the Attwater Prairie Chicken Refuge located near Eagle Lake. There are two beautiful mounted male and female prairie chickens in the display. This valuable and interesting memorabilia was furnished by his daughters Mary Waddell Baker and Ruthie Waddell Reese.

Our tool and appliance collection continues to grow. H.H. Rose has added pliers, hammers, and a single tree. W.H. Harrison Sr. has donated a metal hammer and a fence mending or building tool. Louis Schorlemmer has given an old wood plane and scythe formerly owned by relatives. The latter

two gifts were from the family of August Sprue and Ed Sprue respectively, who lived at the Koop settlement near Vanderbilt, Texas. Louis also gave the sets of metal shelves that I inadvertently had credited to Wilcox Minimax. O.W. Powers has loaned an Indian knife found by a relative in an old Indian hut near Muskogee, Oklahoma.

We can look forward to seeing and boarding the Texas Sesquicentennial Independence Express in 1986, since the latest proposed route shows an overnight stop in Eagle Lake. It is certainly not too early to be preparing a special railroad display case for this occasion and for our community viewers at the present. If you have any items for this display, please let me know. While True has given us an old red railroad lantern and dated railroad nails. Many of you who know me are quite aware that I'm a railroad fan, so, of course, I want to add to this display.

Thelma Thomas Adams had donated xeroxed sheets of a booklet owned by her late aunt Berta Smith. This booklet was the 1904-05 Yearbook of the Methodist Episcopal Church South of Eagle Lake. The Rev. William Nickels was the pastor. Valuable information, such as the church roll, activities, and organizations were included. One of the latter was the Epworth League, which many of you readers probably remember attending. Many interesting ads helped pay for this booklet, and I'll include two of them this time and perhaps more later. These are as follows:
