He served as president of the Texas Associated Press Broadcasters for two terms and he was a board member of the Texas Association of Broadcasters. He was also co-chairman of the Texas Association of Broadcasters' Up and Coming Committee.

The first Texas Associated Press Broadcasters' Scholarship will be awarded in Hawkins' memory.

Hawkins is survived by his wife, Jeanette, and a daughter, Kimberly.

He was always actively involved with local projects, organizations and events wherever he was. "He will be greatly missed by his family, friends, and those who worked with him," said Darrel Appell, general manager of KULM in Columbus and a former associate of Hawkins at Burnet.

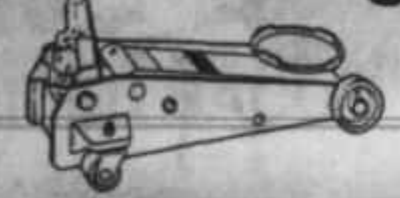
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
