Seal coating for highways

Plans for the placing of a seal coat on the surface of highways in District 13 were discussed during a pre-construction meeting held on July 25 in Yoakum. Missouri Petroleum Products of St. Louis, Missouri was the low bidder for the project at \$1,494,380.28, which includes work in Austin, Calhoun, Colorado, DeWitt, Fayette, Gonzales, Jackson, Lavaca and Wharton counties. E. J. Blaschke, supervising resident engineer in charge of the project, said, "The seal coat, which is a thin coating of asphalt covered by rock, is applied to the surface of highways to help preserve the roads and provide a more skid-resistant surface. To minimize inconvenience and delay to motorists, the seal coat will be applied to only one-half the roadway width at one time. Where needed, flagmen will be assisting traffic through the construction area."

Immunizations for Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis and Rubella will be given to infants, preschoolers, and school children. Tetanus and or Diphtheria will be given to adults.

Red Cross swimming lessons for adults, special education students and lifeguards are scheduled for the second and third weeks of August.

At the Eagle Lake Pool, lessons will be on August 13, 15, 16, 19, 20 and 22. The purpose of this course is to certify or recertify lifeguards for swimming pools. In order to participate, person must be 15 years old by Monday, August 12 and be able to perform the following pre-requisites: 1) a standing front drive in reasonably good form; 2) swim

From 4:30 to 6 p.m., special education students; 7 to 8 p.m., adult beginners and advanced beginners.

Lessons will be free except for a \$5 pool fee. If interested, drop by the pool and fill out a registration form by Friday,

August 2. Six people must register for each class to be held.

An advanced lifesaving class will be held at the Sheridan Pool from 8 to 11 a.m. on the following days: August 13, 15, 16, 19, 20 and 22. The purpose of this course is to certify or recertify lifeguards for swimming pools. In order to participate, person must be 15 years old by Monday, August 12 and be able to perform the following pre-requisites: 1) a standing front drive in reasonably good form; 2) swim

500 yards continuously, using a front crawl stroke, a sidekick stroke on the back using an inverted scissors or breaststroke kick, and breaststroke; 3) dive from surface to a minimum depth of 6 feet and swim 20 feet underwater; 4) tread water for one minute.

Cost of the course will be \$25 for book and instructor fees. If interested, fill out a registration form at either the Eagle Lake or Sheridan pools by Tuesday, August 6. Judy Pustejovsky will be the instructor for the above course. If you have any questions, give her a call at 234-6558.
