

Efficient irrigation system saves soil as well as water

Irrigated acres have the potential for serious erosion problems, says Wilson Sealing, chief of USDA's Soil Conservation Service. As much as 70 tons of sediment yield per acre has been measured on some furrow irrigated fields, which is 20 times above acceptable soil erosion levels for those soils.

Fortunately, the potential exists on irrigated lands for soil and water savings, says Sealing. SCS is helping irrigators, especially in water-short or highly erosive areas, to evaluate the efficiency of their irrigation systems and is recommending ways to improve them.

Any irrigation system should be part of a complete conservation plan, district conservationist Connie Fair said. Improved irrigation practices conserve and protect water as well as soil. And soil erosion is being recognized more and more as a problem not only on the farm, but beyond the farm gate too.

More than 65 million acres of the Nation's cropland is irrigated — almost three-fourths with furrow, or flood, irrigation and the rest with sprinkler systems.

Applying too much water — or applying it the wrong way, especially on sloped fields — erodes soil and carries sediment, nutrients and pesticides into streams, lakes and rivers.

Overirrigation can also cause water to percolate beyond the root zone into ground water and carry pollutants to underground supplies.

In some states, SCS field employees are using mobile field water conservation laboratories to help irrigators conserve water. SCS and other USDA, federal, state and local agencies are cooperating to help farmers develop irrigation systems that are compatible with local soils, climates, crops, water supplies and climate.

Land slides fatal

Deadly cave-ins in pits and ditches kill or seriously injure several construction workers in Texas every year.

Dennis Ressel, soil scientist for the USDA Soil Conservation Service at La Grange, said slides in clay soils probably kill more people each year than those in sandy soils.

"Most people are careful around and because they know it caves easily," Ressel said. "But they think a thick, tough clay soil will not slip, yet most clay soils shrink when dry and swell when wet. This causes slick pressure plates to develop beneath the soil surface."

Ressel said the pressure plates, called slickensides, are similar to two pieces of glass pressing against each other. When a ditch or pit is dug through the plate, especially when the soil is moist, the soil can — and does — suddenly slip, causing a cave-in.

The solution is to use metal or wooden braces to shore up sides of any ditch dug into a soil with a potential slide hazard. Ditches five feet deep or deeper should be protected. SCS has published soil surveys for most counties that can be used to identify soils with a high slide potential. Free copies are available to engineers, builders, contractors or others interested in construction hazards.

Revenue bonds being sold for generating unit

Lower Colorado River Authority directors authorized July 23 the sale of \$275 million in revenue bonds for a lignite-fired third generating unit at the Fayette Project near La Grange.

The issue is the second of approximately \$4.3 billion in revenue bonds for the Fayette 3 unit, mine facilities at the nearby Cummins Creek area in northern Fayette County, and related general improvement projects such as transmission lines and substations.

L.C.R.A. officials estimate total cost for Fayette 3 unit, mine and mine facilities for Fayette 3 and a companion unit at \$442 million. The 400-megawatt Fayette 3 is scheduled to be ready for operation in mid-1985.

The L.C.R.A. bonds received "A" ratings from both major rating agencies: Moody's Investors Service Inc. and Standard & Poor's Corporation.

Farm value of food basket
For the first time since 1978, the farm value of a typical basket of food increased more in 1984 than did the retail food price increase. The farm value of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's market basket of foods rose 5.3 percent last year, notes an economist with the Texas A&M University System.

However, because of depressed farm prices over several years, the 1984 farm value of foods was only 7 percent above the 1980 value. During that same time, retail food prices increased 17 percent. The farm value averaged 34 percent of the retail cost for a market basket of food last year.
