**Cows cause accidents**

Cows on FM 3013 caused two wrecks last week. A tractor-trailer rig killed several animals then a pickup truck hit one of the carcasses. Early Monday morning, August 5, a rice truck owned by American Rice Inc., traveling west, struck at least eight cows owned by Howard Wiese that wandered onto the road between Seely and Eagle Lake. Approximately 5 to 10 minutes later, a Chevrolet truck, owned and driven by Robert Davis, hit one of the cows in the road. James Brune Jr. and Wayne Brisco, both of Eagle Lake, were

passengers in Davis' truck. The truck flipped several times landing on its roof. Investigating the accident was DPS officer Gary Eden with sheriff's deputy Marty Moore assisting. It was reported the cows apparently got out a gate Wiese said he never uses. Davis, Brisco and Brune received cuts and abrasions and Brune injured his neck. The rice truck driver was not hurt. ### Alligator tag issuance set for county

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department officials have announced general boundaries within which alligators may be legally hunted during the September 6-22, 1985 hunting season.

Alligator tags for the 1985 season will be issued on a quota basis to landowners or their authorized agents. Tag quotas are based on estimated alligator populations. A total of 925 tags

will be available for issuance this year, compared to 780 available for the 1984 hunting season, according to Bruce Thompson, alligator program leader. There were 474 tags issued and 487 alligators taken in 1984.

The Eagle Lake area will receive 15 permits and the Eagle Lake Gravel Pits will receive 1 permit. Thompson said tag quotas are established based on sur-

vey data, and they may vary among different types of habitat and possibly within single-ownership tracts. Applications for tags may be made at the times and places specified by the department.

Thompson reminds hunters that alligators must be taken and retrieved only with devices that have line of at least 300-pound-test attached. Legal devices include hook and line, harpoon, gig, archery tackle and hand-held snare. Firearms may not be used except to dispatch the animals after being secured.

Hunting hours for alligators are 30 minutes before sunrise until sunset. Hook and line sets may not be placed until 30 minutes before sunrise on September 6. Alligators may be removed from lines, and may be hunted with other legal capture devices, only during this time period.

Hunters are advised to use 90 stainless steel hooks and 3/16 inch braided (not twisted) nylon line for leaders and 1/4 inch poly rope for the sets. The most effective method for taking alligators is by suspending the hook baited with meat over the water from a pole driven into the marsh bottom.

Prospective alligator buyers, parts dealers and farmers are reminded that they should be sure they have valid federal permits for any planned commercial or propagation activities involving alligators.
