Go-Texan events at fair

Colorado County Go-Texan Ambassador, Henry Potter, announces that the Go-Texan committee will again sponsor three events in conjunction with the Colorado County Fair, the barbecue cookoff, the hay hauling contest and the horsehoe pitching contest. There will be two divisions in each contest, the Go-Texan division open only to residents of Colorado County and the Open division in which residents of any county can participate. Winners in the Go-Texan division will represent Colorado County at the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo next February and for this reason must be residents of the county. All three contests will be held on Sunday, September 15, at the Fairgrounds in Columbus. Judge Lester Crane and Richard Clippson will serve as co-chairmen of the barbecue cookoff. Teams entering the cookoff must check in and set up between 6 and 9 p.m. Saturday, September 14 or 7:30 and 9 a.m. on Sunday, September 15. A team consists of a chief cook and up to three assistants. Contestants must cook a minimum of 10 pounds of barbecue which may consist of beef, chicken, rabbit, pork or lamb. Judging will be at 4 p.m. Sunday, September 15. Trophies will be awarded to the Colorado County Go-Texan Champion, the Open Champion and the Most Colorful Team. Entry blanks and rules for the barbecue cookoff may be obtained by contacting Judge Crane at 732-2894 in Columbus or Richard Clippson at 234-7685 in Eagle Lake.

The hay hauling contest will be held at 2 p.m. Sunday, September 15, at the livestock area of the fairgrounds. The objective of the contest will be to load 42 bales of hay on a conventional 1/4 ton pickup truck, drive through a designated obstacle course, unload and stack the hay. It is a timed event and the best time wins. Teams will consist of three members. Each team must provide its own bales. Each bale must weigh at least 45 pounds. Trophies will be awarded to the Colorado County Champion and the Open Champion. Rules and entry forms may be obtained from contest chairman Henry Potter at 732-6832 in Columbus.

Chairman for the horsehoe pitching contest will be Leslie Heinsohn of Freburg. The contest will be held starting at 10 a.m. Sunday, September 15, at the livestock area of the fairgrounds. Teams will consist of two members and a round robin format will be used. Trophies will be awarded to the Colorado County Go-Texan Champion and the Open Champion.

Entry forms and rules for all three events can also be picked up at Weimar City Hall, First National Bank in Eagle Lake, Potter's Western Store in Columbus and Heinsohn's in Freburg.
