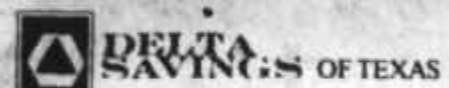

Solar interest rising

The rising cost of energy is rising the interest in solar power among Texans.

The Energy Efficiency Division of the Public Utility Commission of Texas has free consumer information on the most popular solar equipment — solar water heaters. Solar water heating was the "in" thing in the 1970s. Later, it didn't compete with inexpensive gas and electric energy.

Now solar water heating is back, primarily because of today's cost of energy. This is evidenced by the growing number of solar water heating manufacturers.

The Public Utility Commission of Texas advises consumers to do three things: (1) review the kinds of solar water heating equipment available; (2) estimate the anticipated cost over the life time of the equipment as compared to your fuel costs; and (3) consult with equipment dealers, installers or engineers who have solar ex-
