The Sheriff's office would like to remind everyone that the Sheriff's Department still maintains engraving tools for your use. Many have taken advantage of these tools to mark their property. Should you need assistance in marking your property, contact the Sheriff's office and they will assist you. Marking your property will assist us should it become stolen or lost.
