Norris tosses Little League no-hitter

Tuesday the Dodgers' ace, everything, Pooh Norris, (catcher turned pitcher) threw a no-hitter at the Yankees, allowing them three runs on six bases on balls and Dodger error, while fanning 11 including seven of the last nine he faced.
At the same time his teammates were filling the base paths with runners. They scored five in the top of the first, one in the third and one in the fourth, while stranding three runners on base in each of the first three innings and one more in the fourth, winner was Norris and the loser was Matt Wilson.

Friday was a different story as Shawn Turner (2-1) lined up against Reggie Donner (0-0). In the top of the first, Donner fanned Everitt Ramirez and Chad Sunderman, before giving up a pass to Matt Wilson and then getting Pat Powers to ground out Williams to Norris, third to first. In the bottom of the inning, Turner returned the favor, setting down Kevin Williams and Todd Mascheck before passing Kevin Diggins and getting Pooh on a called third strike.

The Yanks scored two in the second on a single by John Gonzales. A hot shot to third by Chris Mareksa that Williams booted. Ramon and Shawn walked before Donner got Darrel Anderson on a swinging third strike for the first out. He fanned Everitt for the second time to get the second out and when Chad Sunderman hit to third, Williams put out Ramon unassisted to end the inning.
In the bottom of the second, Turner pitched Armando Garza and Reggie Donner on base on successive walks before getting Rich Beth, Jamie Green and Marcus Diggins all on called third strikes.

The top of the third went in order as Matt Wilson was retired, Beth to Norris: Powers went down Kevin Diggins at short to Marcus Diggins at first and John Gonzales hit to Rich Beth at second. The bottom of the third saw Williams walk and steal second and third before Turner fanned Todd, Kevin Diggins and Pooh.

The Yanks sent six men to the plate in the fourth and managed to score another run as Chris Mareksa led off with a walk and advanced on a passed ball by Donner: Then home on an overthrow, Sunderman grounded out to Marcus Diggins at first to end the Yanks rally with the bags loaded. The Dodgers meekly went down in the bottom of the inning on called strikes to Porree Hernandez, Rich Beth and Rodney Sosa.

The last bat for the Yanks added two more runs on five Dodgers errors. The circus began on a throwing error by the second sacker, putting Wilson on first. Then on only the second hit by the Yanks, Pat Powers sent a line short to left center which Porree overthrew to second allowing Wilson to score and Beth overthrew home and Turner to stop the rally.
