Memorials to Drs. Laughlin fund new ELCH equipment

Through generous donations by the community to the Ladies Auxiliary, and by Mrs. Avis Laughlin, wife of the late Dr. J.C. Laughlin, a new piece of diagnostic equipment has been purchased for the Respiratory Care Department of Eagle Lake Community Hospital.

It is a new Pulmonary Function Analyzer costing about \$10,000, and is only the third one installed in Texas.

After the death of Dr. Laughlin, his many friends in the community contributed several thousand dollars to the auxiliary in his memory. The auxiliary often purchases equipment for the hospital, and with Mrs. Laughlin's contribution, the machine was donated in memory of Dr. J.C. Laughlin and Dr. J.R. Laughlin.

This is a state of the art system which employs a low resistance, flow-based pneumotach spirometer interfaced with an IBM-PC computer, according to Tom Shuler, the hospital's director of respiratory care. The system analyzes data pertaining to lung capacities, flow rates and lung volumes.

These parameters aid the physician in diagnosing and treating both the acute and chronic lung disease process such as asthma and emphysema.

Since the system is based around the multi-function desktop computer, it also will permit the respiratory care department to better maintain patient records in other areas such as arterial blood gas data management, quality control and patient billing. The flexibility of this system will permit future expansion of diagnostics by adding even more sophisticated equipment, Shuler said. These added features could include diffusion studies, breath-by-breath pulmonary exercise and metabolic measurements, and much more, he added.

"The Respiratory Care Department and the hospital again would like to thank Mrs. J.C. (Avis) Laughlin and the Lady's Auxiliary for their combined donations. With continued community support such as this, Eagle Lake Community Hospital will continue to better serve the needs of the community," Shuler said. He has been at the hospital since March.
