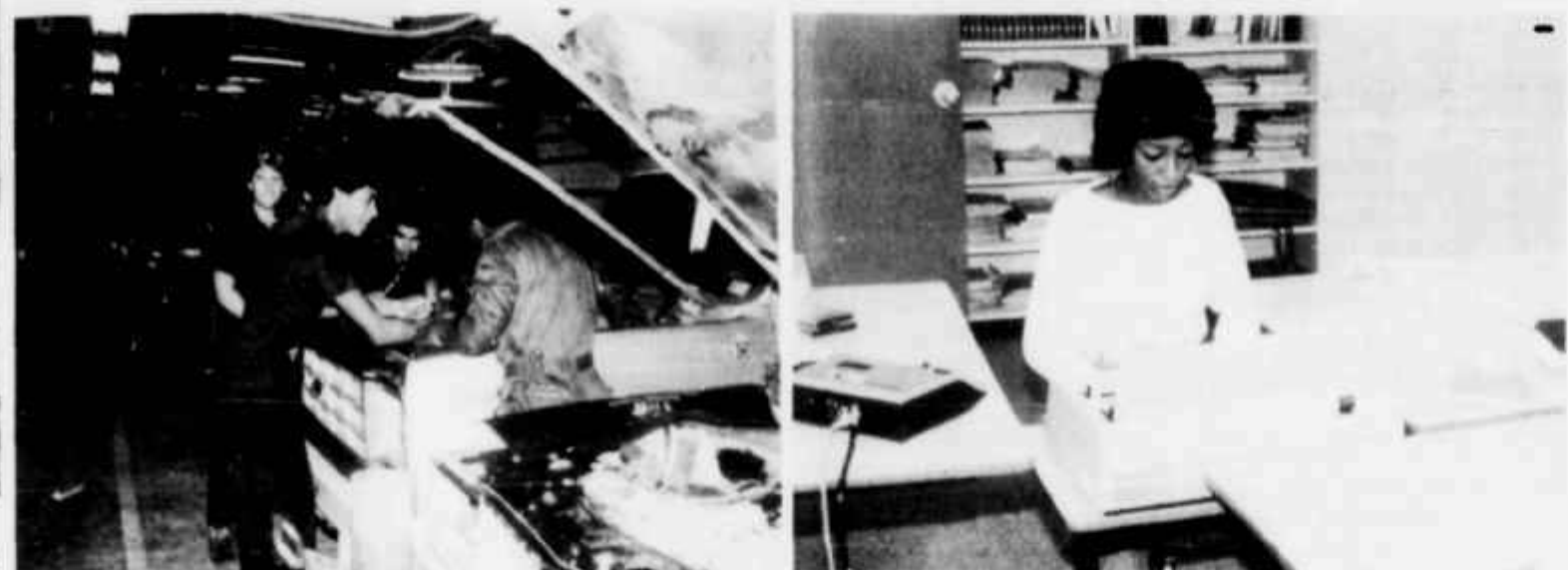

Mary and Rollin Baker to address the Texas Chapter of the Explorers Club

"Recollections of 45 years of field work in Latin America" will be the topic of a commentary slide presentation by Mary and Rollin Baker to members of the Texas Chapter of the Explorers Club at their spring meeting to be held February 15 at the Houston Petroleum Club.

Beginning in 1938 and, except for biological work for what is now the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and WWII duty, until his retirement in 1982, Baker had the good fortune and mostly in private-donor financial support to lead more than 30 major museum expeditions to study animals in their native environments in the

back country of foreign areas, mostly to Mexico and other republics in Latin America.

Mary participated in many of these, serving as photographer, collector and observer, and a sometime camp cook (but never, as she emphasizes, as dishwasher). Each of these 30-60 days of fieldcamp adventures had been the subject of more than 100 of Baker's scientific publications.

Mary and Rollin Baker will also attend the 82nd Annual Dinner of the parent Explorers Club to be held on March 22 in the Grand Ballroom of New York's Waldorf-Astoria Hotel. This will be the first time that Mary has been to this function, although, as she says, her husband has been a member for 20 or so years and attended a few of these annual dinners without her. She has expressed great interest in the evening agenda including meeting Everest-climber and the Club's Honorary President Sir Edmund Hillary; listening to the featured illustrated lecture by Dr. Robert Ballard, who recently located and photographed the Titanic, and dining on the evening's meal. The menu will be an exact recreation of that served aboard the S.S. Titanic on that fatal evening of April 12, 1912.

Exam registration packets available at UH-Victoria

Registration packets for the Texas Examination of Current Administrators and Teachers (TECAT) are available from the University of Houston-Victoria division of education.

All persons who are issued valid Texas teacher certificates prior to February 1, 1986, must take the test to continue their certification. Successful performance on the TECAT will be required for employment in Texas public schools after June 30.

The examination will be administered at public schools around the state four times during 1986. (This would exclude the March 10 exam, for which some teachers in the public schools have already registered.) Test dates are April 12, June 28, July 12 and October 4. Candidates will be required to pay a \$30 examination fee.

CCA board of elections set

Combined Community Action, Inc. (CCA), the anti-poverty agency serving Baiting, Fayette, Lee, Colorado and Austin counties, will be holding elections this month for representation of low-income residents of Colorado County to serve on the CCA board of directors. The bylaws of CCA, a non-profit, tax exempt corporation, require that the governing board of directors be representatives of three sectors of the community: one-third public officials (commissioners court and city councils), one-third elected representatives of the poor population, and one-third appointed from the private sector (industry, business, civic, religious, education and social groups).

Election of a low-income representative for Precincts 1 and 2 of Colorado County will be held at a public meeting on Thursday, February 20, at 1:30 p.m. The meeting will be at Providence Baptist Church, 1207 E. State, Eagle Lake. All low-income residents of Precincts 1 and 2 who are participants in CCA programs are eligible to vote in this election.

Representatives serve for a two year term. Qualifications for service are as follows: must be a U.S. citizen; must reside in the precincts from which he or she is elected; must be 18 years of age or older; must declare his or her willingness to serve on the Combined Community Action board.

The board of directors oversees the administration of the Combined Community Action, and is responsible for the planning, approval, monitoring, and evaluation of all CCA programs. The election of representatives of the poor has been established to insure maximum feasible participation of the low-income population in these activities. Results of the election will be certified, and the new representatives seated at the February regular meeting of the CCA board.
