RHS gym site for boys bi-district double header

Rice High School is making its facilities available this Friday for double-header bi-district basketball games, according to principal Fred Graham.

Shiner and Weimar, representing district 27-2A champions and runners-up respectively, will face Canado and Stafford of district 28-2A. Exact opponents won't be known until the district 28 teams break their 8-1 record deadlock to decide who the champion will be. Shiner, 9-1 in district play and 16-2 overall, will play the runner up in that district, while Weimar, 8-2 for district play, will face the champion.

Local basketball fans who enjoy watching the sport can begin the games, scheduled to begin at 6 p.m.

Spring sports on schedule at ELMS, Garwood, Sheridan

Spring sports enthusiasts at the junior high school level in the Rice district will be active again this year, according to coaches at the Eagle Lake, Garwood and Sheridan schools.

Track will be the major sport of the season, although tennis team practice began Monday at Eagle Lake Middle School. At the Garwood School, coach Mike Michalka had hoped to form a golf team, but ran into problems when golf clubs couldn't be found for those interested in learning to play. Also in Garwood, several eighth grade students are interested in baseball, and may opt for participation in the senior little league that starts in that area, in March or April. That league is not a school-sponsored activity.

At Eagle Lake, track meets have been scheduled March 1, boys and girls at El Campo; March 15, boys and girls at the Brazos Relays in Wallis; March 21, boys only, East Bernard track meet, and on April 11, the district track meet is scheduled, probably in Yoakum.

The annual Eagle Lake Middle School track meet for boys and girls from here, as well as several area schools, is scheduled on the ELMS field on Saturday April 5.

Coach Bennie Machac at Sheridan said he is taking boys and girls from that school in the Sacred Heart track meet in Hallettsville on March 1.

Sheridan and Garwood track athletes then will combine into one team and participate in a meet on March 15 at Brazos Consolidated, and at the Eagle Lake Middle School meet on April 5.

Raider girls fall in first bi-district game, 34-33

It seems defeat is in the cards for the Rice High School girls varsity basketball team when it comes to bi-district competition, as the team has lost its second bi-district game in as many years.

But last Thursday's loss to Phlogerville in Dime Box doesn't mean the school is writing off post-district competition.

Coach Mike Tankersley said Monday morning that although the team is losing seven players to graduation, two of the five starters will be returning and a freshman who played on the varsity also will be available.

The returning players are Lakeshia Jackson and Lynn McGrew. Yolanda Diggins is the freshman who will be returning as a sophomore.

As for the sudden, and unexpected end to the 1985-86 campaign, Coach Tankersley said that Phlogerville managed to throw a wrench in the Raider offense, and the RHS team was unable to adjust. They scored only three points in the final quarter.

The Raiders girls however kept up the pressure on defense, giving up 15 points in the first quarter, but allowing Phlogerville only 19

points all told in the last three quarters. It appears the Raiders just met their match. While they were defeated in district play, none of those games provided much competition for the Raiders. However, in the tough pre-district schedule, the girls were 8-7.

The game Thursday provided exciting competition. The Raiders trailed at one point in the second quarter 19-10 but lead 30-28 at the end of the third. In that fatal fourth quarter, the team knew it would be a tight finish and attempted to play for better shots, but were unsuccessful.

With spring sports in mind, seven RHS weight lifters take wins Saturday at invitational meet

With basketball season out of the way, athletics at Rice High School have turned to spring sports -- baseball, track, tennis and golf, and the spring conditioning and exercise programs scheduled for football and basketball players.

This past weekend, 20 Raider athletes competed in an invitational weight lifting tournament at Port Lavaca Calhoun High School. They came home with two first place awards, three second place awards and two third place awards.

Also, Alcario Barrios was overall third place winner in the light weight class, and Brian Balas was third overall in that class, according to Coach Gary McNeal who accompanied the lifters. McNeal said Barrios' second place in the 132-pound

class came after he was beaten by the lifter who also won first overall. Coach Don Wild also went with the group. See the box accompanying this story for results.

While practice for most spring sports is underway, play began this week for the tennis team, and for the baseball team, it starts next week.

The baseball team, under coach McNeal, will host Bishop Forest (Schulenburg) next Tuesday at 4 p.m. at the RHS baseball diamond. District play starts Friday, April 4th.

Hosman, Scott, Williams sign scholarships

Three football players on Rice High School's championship football team the past two years, signed scholarships last Wednesday providing them cost-free education.

Tony Hosman signed with Lamar University in Beaumont and Cleve Scott and Rodney Williams signed with Texas A&I University in Kingsville. RHS athletic director Clifton Darden said that in the nine-years since he has been at Rice, only two other players had signed scholarships.

Assistant Lamar coach Doyle Parker, who worked with Lamar's head coach Ray Albom when he was at Rice University, was at RHS last Wednesday to watch Hosman do the signature honors. Albom was at RHS a week ago to talk with Hosman and tell him the scholarship was available.

Hosman, stands 6-4 and weighs 240 pounds, was a defensive and offensive lineman for the Raiders, playing on the varsity team during all four of his years as a Raider. He holds the record for playing in the most varsity football games at the school. Scott, a 6-foot, 180 pound defensive back, and Williams, a 6-4, 235 pound linebacker, were signed by A&I assistant coach Don Pittman last Wednesday morning. Those two will be

playing on the team with Columbus Cardinals. Anthony Faldyn, a 5-11, 170 pound running back, Columbus Cardinals Percy Waddle, 6-2, 175, signed with Southwest Conference champion Texas A&M University. Waddle has been named a high school all-American football player.
