the streets to be improved. City crews have drawn up a list of proposed streets, which will be published in next week's Headlight. However, as Mr. Gordon was told, the list is only a proposed one. Should materials and labor costs exceed estimates, the list will be cut.

At the present, city manager Bob Klockman is working on the budget for the city's next accounting year, which begins April 1. Mayor Elmer Struss said Tuesday he has told Klockman to keep the expenses down, so the current 28-cent per \$100 valuation tax levy can remain unchanged. If voters approve the bond question on streets, that should be fairly easy since as much as \$30,000 that was spent this year on street repair could be devoted to other items.

At the present, seven tons of the 28-cent tax levy is devoted solely to pay for previous bond issues approved in the city. The two issues to be voted on April 5 could add ten to 12 cents to that rate. That means that if your property is taxed at a total of \$50,000, your tax increase would be \$50 a year.

In other business, council learned the highway department visited Eagle Lake recently and agreed with the city's application for flashing warning lights, and a crossing guard arms should be installed on Lake St.

The city has paid its five percent share of that project, and the remainder is to be paid by the state and federal government. The letter to the city said the warning lights and arms should be installed this year.

In the meantime, the state recommended, and council agreed, that stop signs should be installed on Lake St., on either side of the
