1985 Group IV variety soybean trials

The County Extension Office is very optimistic regarding the potential adaptability of the Group IV soybeans for this area. Due to the dry late spring and early summer last year most yields were down last year.

A critical point in successfully planting these varieties is that they be planted between April 1 and April 15. Major deviation from those planting produces a stalk that is too short for successful harvest.

The 1985 Colorado County test was farmed by Arthur Mahalik and Sons at Matthews and planted on March 28. Four additional counties in the Gulf Coast area were to have had tests in 1985 but they were cancelled due to adverse

planting conditions. There will be four test locations in this area in 1986.

1985 Group IV test results are as follows: Soybean yields from variety result demonstrations with Group IV soybeans in Texas for 1985 include: RA 452 variety, 51.0 yield for Colorado County; 14.1 for Calhoun County; 18.7 for Delta County; 29.0 for Lamar County; 28.2 average yield.

RA Mitchell 450 variety, 37.6, Colorado County; 15.3, Calhoun; 25.3, Delta; 36.0, Lamar; 27.0 average. RA 480 variety, 39.3, Colorado; 15.9, Calhoun; 23.6, Delta; 28.0, Lamar; 26.7 average. RA 481 variety, 58.0, Colorado; 13.9, Calhoun; 14.1, Delta; 20.0, Lamar; 26.3 average. JMS 4982 variety, 25.6, Colorado; 16.8, Calhoun; 27.8, Delta; 32.0,

Lamar; 25.6 average. Crawford variety, 12.1, Calhoun; Pioneer 9471 variety, 31.6, Colorado; 10.7, Calhoun; RA X67 variety, 20.7, Colorado; 11.0, Lamar.

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County Judge Lester Cranek chairs HGAC review committee

April 2 is the date of the 1986 "kick-off" meeting of the Regional Review Committee, the group of 12 local elected officials from all the counties in the 13-county area served by the Houston-Galveston Area Council (H-GAC), except Harris County, who over the next few months will be evaluating grant applications from cities and counties for funding under the Texas Community Development Program.

The Regional Review Committee is chaired by County Judge Lester J. Cranek of Colorado County. The Texas Community Development Program awards money — with no local matching funds required — which can be used by local governments to make public facility and house improvements, such as drainage and street repair, wastewater treatment facilities, and housing rehabilitation projects. The funds can be crucial to local government efforts to preserve the quality of neighborhoods and to upgrade

basic facilities, particularly those which serve low and moderate income persons.

The H-GAC group will hold its initial meeting on this year's evaluation process on April 2, at 9 a.m. in the H-GAC conference room, 4th floor, Keplinger Building, 3555 Timmons Lane at Richmond Avenue, in Houston. The public and representatives of all interested communities are encouraged to attend the meeting as well as all future meetings and hearings conducted by the group.

The group will consider and adopt a set of criteria which it will use in evaluating the applications, schedule future meetings to review the applications and hear oral presentations by local representatives, and adopt general procedures in order to maximize public input before the regional priorities are established and sent to Austin for State review and announcement of grant awards by the Governor.

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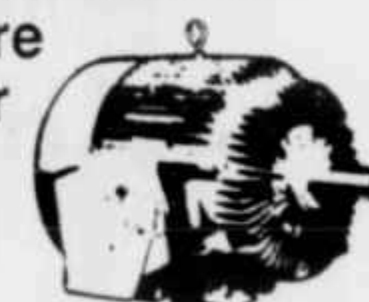
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
