

## 2 golf tournaments this month

### Lions Club Invitational is scheduled April 27th

More than 100 golfers will be competing for more than \$6,000 in cash and prizes this weekend as the Eagle Lake Recreation Center hosts its annual Best Ball Partnership tournament on Saturday and Sunday.

Tournament play will start at 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. on both days, with some of the top local and area golfers making up the field. Among the highlights of the tournament will be the awarding of \$250 both days for the golfer who wins the closest-to-the-hole contest on the first par three of the round.

The 16th annual Eagle Lake Lions Club invitational golf tournament is scheduled to be played on the Eagle Lake Recreation Center course Sunday, April 27.

Tournament director Lion Larry Dulany said that since early response to tournament invitations has been heavier than usual, he expects more than 100 players.

Joe Frazar assisted Dulany in securing the prizes that will be awarded to 25 golfers in five flights. The tournament is limited to 128 players.

The girls of the Rice High School track team, under coach Debbie Johnson, won 4th place last weekend in a track meet in Sealy, with two of the team members capturing first place finishes.

Emelda Clayton continued her good performances by winning the 100 meter dash. Terri Clayton was first in the 200 meter dash. Manha McTeer placed 4th in the 400 meter dash, while Sheryl McGrew was 6th.

The Rice 400 meter relay team was second. Team members are Veronica Woods, McGrew and the Claytons. The 800 meter relay team of Lisa Brown, Woods and the Claytons placed 4th. Also placing 4th was the 1600 meter relay team of Lynn Brzozowski, Woods, McTeer and McGrew.

Lakeshia Jackson won 5th place in the shotput and Lisa Brown was 6th in the triple jump.

The team will compete this Friday in Bellville.

In sports, Ron McGrew was second in his division in the power lifting, and Alcaro Barros was first in his division. This is the first year for RHS in that competition and coach Gary McNeal expects added victories in the future. There was only one senior and one junior on the team this year with six sophomores. McGrew and Barros will compete in regionals at UT, also on April 26. Brian Balas and Doug Tillman were fourth in their class.

Unopposed RCISD candidates elected; Briscoe board president

Even though there was no opposition, more than 500 Rice School District voters turned out Saturday to give Natalie Dupre and John Mathews a vote of confidence.

There were 484 votes cast in Eagle Lake, 45 in Garwood and 35 in Sheridan. Dupre drew 401 votes in Eagle Lake, 35 in Sheridan and 44 in Garwood. Mathews won 455 votes in Eagle Lake, 29 in Sheridan and 39 in Garwood.

The school board met Monday night and canvassed the election and swore in the two candidates. John Mathews replaces Steve Balas who chose not to seek re-election.

The board also voted Reggie Briscoe as its president, Fritz Leopold as vice president, and Wayne Corman as secretary.

The date for the next board meeting was moved from next Monday to April 27, to allow time for bid information to be received, business as necessary.
