The third annual Sheridan Ambulance Bene-fair is set for Saturday, May 3. Medical laboratory technicians spend two years in intensive training which includes approximately 40-60 hours of college work. Once students complete their college hours and internship, they must still pass a national examination before they can become fully qualified laboratory professionals.

In Texas, only about 10 four-year colleges offer medical technology programs and about 15 junior colleges offer medical laboratory programs of which WCJC is one.

There are many cases of child abuse throughout the United States and the Sheriff's office is very active in investigating child abuse cases in this area. Should you be aware of any child being abused, call the Sheriff's Department and arrangements will be made to look into the matter and the proper authority contacted. Your name will not be revealed unless you authorize us to do so.

In addition to working school traffic in the mornings and afternoons, here is the report for the week of 4-6 through 4-12:

4-6-86: assisted in the recovery of a stolen vehicle east of Columbus; assisted the Eagle Lake police in locating a subject for the Lufkin Sheriff's Department; assisted the Columbus police with a disturbance call; checked on a disturbance in Alleyton; assisted at the scene of an accident on 102.

4-7-86: checked on a possible burglary north of Columbus; checked on mail box damage near Eagle Lake; had JP court; served four civil citations.
